Introducing Professor Kevin J Gaston

The Environment and Sustainability Institute is headed by inaugural Director, Professor Kevin J Gaston. Professor Gaston took up his post in May 2011 having joined the ESI from the University of Sheffield where he had been Professor of Biodiversity and Conservation since 2000, founding and leading the Biodiversity and Macroecology Group (BIOME).

Professor Gaston graduated in Zoology from the University of Sheffield before obtaining a doctorate from the University of York. He then spent five years as a Research Fellow at the Natural History Museum in London, before becoming a Royal Society University Research Fellow at Imperial College. He holds an Honorary Professorship at South Africa's University of Stellenbosch and is an ISI Highly Cited Researcher.

Professor Gaston is currently recruiting academics from a wide range of disciplines to positions aligned to the ESI research themes. On taking up their posts and along with Professors Townley, McDonald and Brown, the faculty will work in partnership with researchers, the Knowledge Exchange Managers and our stakeholders to meet the vision of the ESI,

'to enhance lives through improving people's relationships with the environment'.
