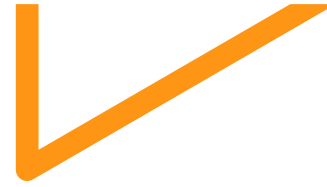





Getting from Gatwick Airport

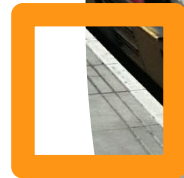




There's several ways to continue your journey

Travelling By Train

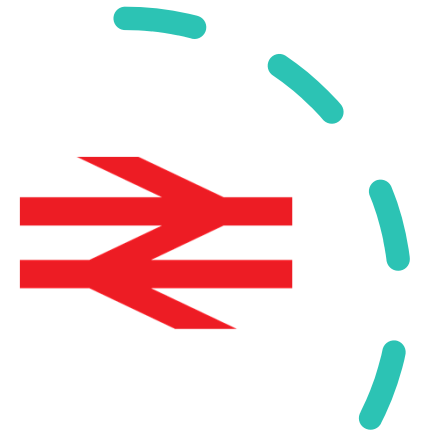
When you arrive at Gatwick Airport you will need to catch the train from the South Terminal. If you are due to arrive in the North Terminal you can catch a free shuttle to the South Terminal.

Trains from Gatwick Airport to Exeter St David's run twice an hour throughout the day and the journey roughly takes 3.5 hours.

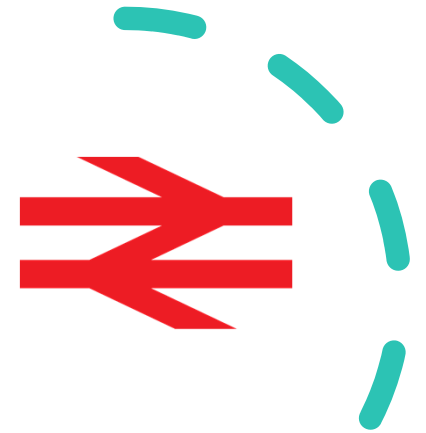
You will have to change at either Reading or Clapham Junction.

Travelling By Coach

To travel by coach you must first make your way to London Victoria Coach station.

- Catch the train from the South Terminal to London Victoria Coach station. The journey is roughly 30 minutes long.
- Tickets can be purchased from within the South Terminal or online here: <https://www.thetrainline.com/>

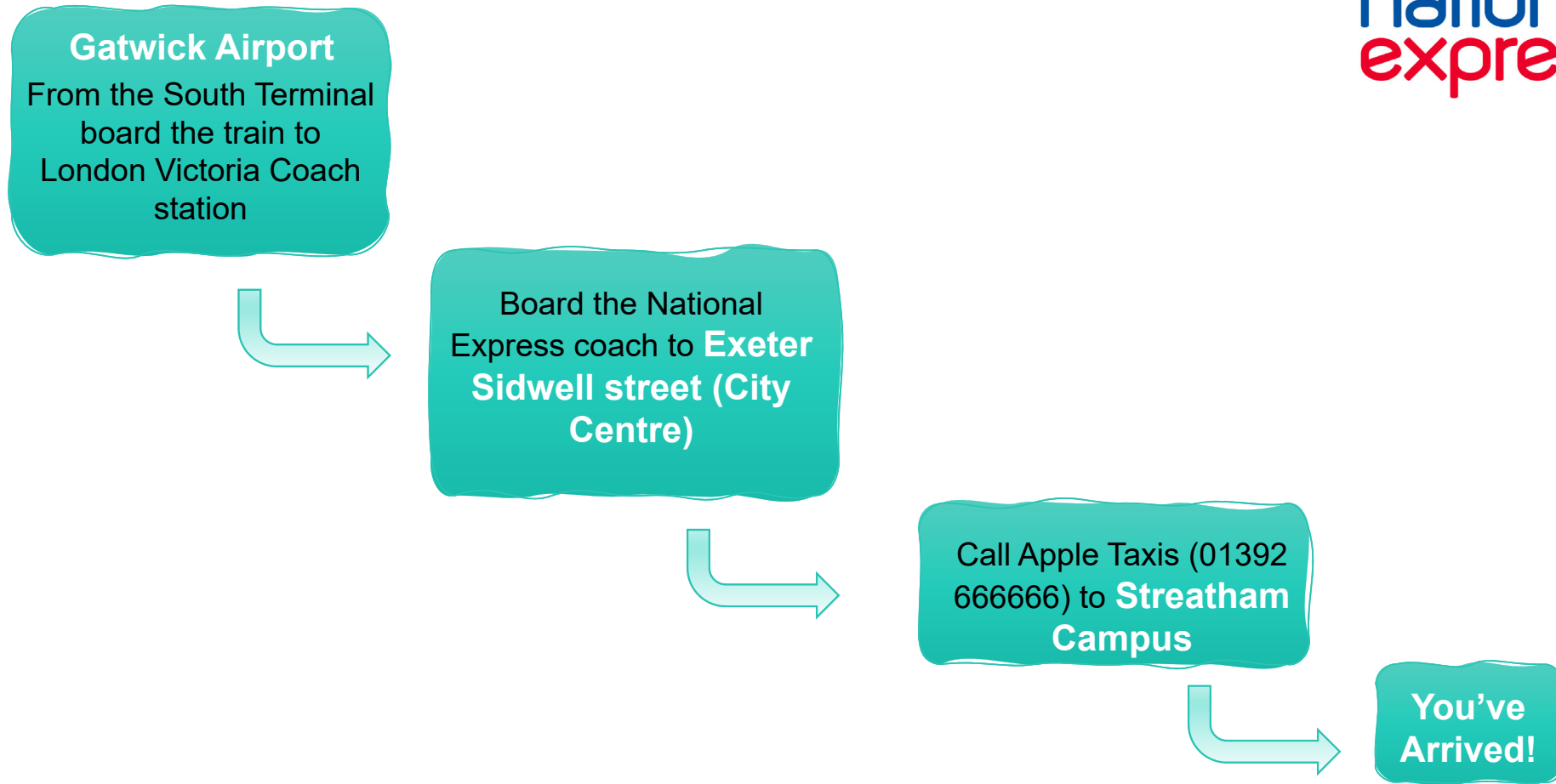
National Express coaches to Exeter St David's take roughly 5 hours with no changes and there are multiple coaches each day.
