### Sports facilities (60 on campus map)

The Sports Park on the Streatham Campus recently benefitted from an £8million development, adding to the already excellent facilities, which include:

- A 90 station gym
- Eight badminton courts
- Two exercise studios
- Four squash courts
- Six covered netball courts
- Exeter Tennis Centre – four indoor and six covered tennis courts
- Sir Christopher Ondaatje Devon Cricket Centre – four indoor nets, bowling machines and indoor game space
- Ocean Physio and Rehab
- Heated swimming pool at Cornwall House (open during Summer)
