The financial sector is the set of institutions, instruments, and the regulatory framework that permit transactions to be made by incurring and settling debts; that is, by extending credit.

What types of organisations would this include?

Financial services are the <u>economic services</u> provided by the finance industry, which encompasses a broad range of organizations that manage money, including <u>credit unions</u>, <u>banks</u>, <u>credit card</u> companies, <u>insurance</u> companies, <u>accountancy</u> companies, <u>consum er finance</u> companies, <u>stock brokerages, investment funds</u> and some <u>government sponsored enterprises</u>.


