

Begin planning your career during your time at university

What you should be doing and when

Don't leave it too late – most graduate positions for the big recruiters close around January at the latest and for internships it is often earlier.

A note for Final Year Students

Although careers information is frequently presented to you broken down by year of study, if you haven't completed the first stages please don't be disconcerted. We recommend that you start your career planning and preparation as soon as you get to university, but if you are now in your final year it's not too late to get started — this information is still relevant to you.

A note for Postgraduate Students

If you haven't already given thought to these milestones during your previous studies, you will need to focus on your career planning as soon as possible. Many job application deadlines fall in the Autumn term so you will need to act quickly so that you don't miss out! Think about the skills required in your preferred occupations. What relevant skills will you gain on your course? Are there any additional skills and experience you need to gain elsewhere?


