In response to requests from home and international students the University has created a new undergraduate degree in Environmental Science for 2012 entry. The programme will be taught at the University's Cornwall Campus and will take full advantage of the unique local environment for fieldwork.



BSc Environmental Sciences

- Enables students to learn the science behind the Earth's amazing complexity and its environmental processes whilst also gaining an understanding of socio-political impacts e.g. Energy Policy, Environment and the Media and Environmental Law.
- Students will benefit from exposure to cutting-edge research through the programme's close relationship with the University's Environment and Sustainability Institute (ESI) – an interdisciplinary centre leading research into the consequences of environmental change and the mitigation and management of its effects.
- Led by expert staff, UK and overseas field trips are embedded into modules throughout the degree and include fieldwork in the amazing ecosystems of the Mojave Desert and West Coast Redwood Forests in California.

Exeter celebrates 25 years of leading research into children's health and exercise

The University of Exeter recently marked a quarter of a century of leading research into children's health and wellbeing. The University founded the Children's Health and Research Centre (CHERC) 25 years ago in response to the preliminary report by the University's Coronary Prevention in Children Research Group. At the time little was known about how children's bodies respond to exercise in relation to growth and maturation, and children were mistakenly treated as 'miniadults'.

The Centre has now disseminated its research through over 600 publications, including 17 books and over 100 book

chapters and review papers. The Centre team has been invited to present its research in 41 countries, made over 500 presentations to international and national conferences and presented over 100 workshops for teachers, paediatricians and researchers.

In addition to its research programme the Children's Health and Exercise Research Centre provided the first PhD training and the first taught MSc programme in paediatric exercise science in the UK.
