Location

The University of Sydney Camperdown/Darlington campus is situated between in the inner-city suburbs of Glebe and Newtown. It is close to Chinatown and Darlington Harbour and a 25-minute drive from the nearest ocean beach. Sydney itself is an exciting, cosmopolitan city with a population of four million that offers more entertainment, shopping and sightseeing than any other city in Australia.

Travel

There is a universities desk at airport arrivals at which you can be advised of the best transport to get you to your accommodation.

Immigration

A valid Student Visa is required. Cost of application approximately AUD\$540 (approximately £275). Once in the country you may apply for a student visa with permission to work (allowing 20 hours per week) at a cost of AUD\$70 (approximately £35.50).

Housing

Even with the new University Village there is limited University accommodation. However, there is a dedicated Accommodation Officer within the International Office who will help you before semester starts to secure accommodation. It is best to arrive at least two weeks before classes start so you can look for accommodation. Shared houses costs from \$110 - \$250 per week.

Health Insurance

You must have Overseas Student Health Cover and you will need evidence of this before you apply for your visa. Cost: \$195 for up to six months cover, \$380 for 12 months.
