Akita International University (AIU) was established in 2003 and is one of Japan's newest, most innovative and most competitive universities. All its courses, except language courses, are taught solely in English. It is an extremely unusual opportunity to study business and economics in English alongside regular full-time Japanese students as well as students from around the world. The Global Business programme includes study visits to local companies, and the university has particular expertise in regional study of China.

Location

The University is located in Yuwa, a suburb on the outskirts of Akita City, approximately 25km from the city centre. Akita Prefecture is in the northern part of the main island of Honshu. Although Akita City has a population of over 300,000, the region is largely rural and mountainous and known for its beautiful national parks, historic towns, coastline and traditional festivals and way of life.

Travel

The University is situated almost adjacent to Akita International Airport, which has daily international flights to Seoul and frequent flights to destinations around Japan. There is also a shinkansen (bullet train) connection with Tokyo, and good regional rail links, as well as a sleeper train to Sapporo.

Access from Narita International Airport (Tokyo) is via transfer to Tokyo's domestic airport, Haneda. There is a regular bus service from the campus to central areas of the city.

Health Insurance

Mandatory for all and obtained on arrival. AIU require students to purchase insurance arranged by the university, at ¥300,000 per semester. Subscribers to the national health insurance scheme pay 30% of costs of treatment or prescriptions. International students may additionally apply for medical fee reimbursement, which covers 80% of fees paid.
