

Location

UNSW is a 38 hectare campus located in Kensington, in the eastern suburbs of Sydney. It is just 20 minutes from the central business district and Sydney Harbour and within walking distance of Coogee Beach. Sydney has 4 seasons which range from 18-35°c in the summer and 8-18°c in the winter. You must wear sunscreen at all times in the summer.

The University of Exeter produces a visa factsheet for students travelling to Australia and, including approximate costs.



UNSW recommend that, as an international student, you live on campus so that you get the most out of university life. There is strong demand for on-campus accommodation, so make sure you apply as soon as you receive your letter of acceptance. Average cost of rent is approximately \$245 per week.
