The University

The University of Queensland is the oldest university in Queensland, and is one of Australia's premier research and learning institutions. Founded in 1909, Queensland has 45,548 students from more than 135 countries and stretches over four main campuses: St Lucia, Ipswich, Gatton and Herston. Students from Exeter will study at the St Lucia campus and will have the opportunity to study Marine Science and Australian flora and fauna with lectures and field trips to the field stations on the Great Barrier Reef, Brisbane Forest Park, Fraser Island World Heritage Area and Australia Zoo.

Location

Brisbane is Australia's third largest city, and the capital of Queensland, with a population of over 2 million. The climate in Queensland is subtropical, and the average temperature in winter is around 21°C. The city centre is culturally vibrant, with recreation parks, botanical gardens and fantastic nightlife and is only a 10-minute drive from the St Lucia campus. The famous beaches of the Gold Coast are one hour's drive south of Brisbane..

Travel

The Brisbane Airport has daily international flights, as well as excellent links to the city centre and to the campus. All newly-arriving international students will be met by University staff; this meet-and-greet service must be booked via the Accommodation website at least 10 days before arrival.

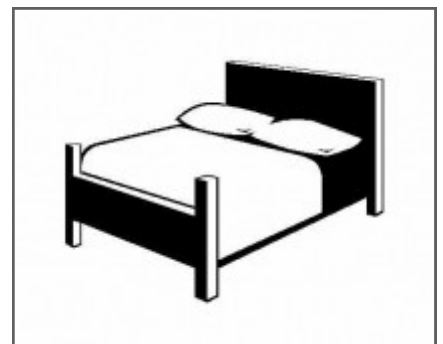

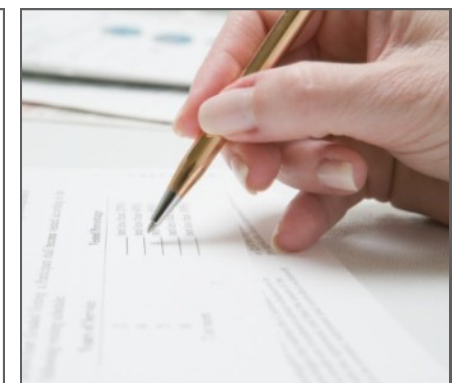
Budget Suggestion

The recommended living allowance for the academic year is between \$22,000-\$27,000 (approximately £13,971-£17,146) which covers accommodation, food, living expenses and incidentals. Housing costs vary from college to college.



Application

- 1 February 2013** Deadline for submitting internal application form accompanied by personal statement, transcript of studies to date and 2 academic references.
- 8 February 2013** Allocation of host institution made (in liaison with Study Abroad Co-ordinators). Students notified and provided with relevant host institution application form.
- 1 March 2013** Deadline for submitting host institution application form and any additional supporting documentation required (e.g. transcript, photographs, financial statements, housing applications etc).
