

Housing

Even with the new University Village there is limited University accommodation. However, there is a dedicated Accommodation Officer within the International Office who will help you before semester starts to secure accommodation. It is best to arrive at least two weeks before classes start so you can look for accommodation. Shared houses costs from \$150 - \$280 per week.
