The maritime districts, such as Cabanyal or Nazaret in earlier times were independent villages but are now integrated into the city. They are located next to the beaches of 'La Malvarrosa' and 'Las Arenas', the weather throughout most of the year is pleasant due to the Mediterranean climate and the minimal rainfall. The temperature in the winter hardly ever falls below 0°c and in the summer it is very warm with a high degree of humidity due to the city's proximity to the sea.
