We support research by:

- Working with researchers to develop appropriate public involvement and engagement opportunities for their research projects
- Providing a fresh perspective and encourage researchers to think about the societal problems their research is addressing
- Commenting on language used in public facing communications, and ensure that plain English is used where necessary
- Acting as steering group members for the Translational Research Exchange @ Exeter and the Centre for Predictive Modelling in Healthcare
- Reviewing grant applications including lay summary
- Helping researchers design public engagement events. These have included creative activities such as a theatre piece
- Helping prepare for public presentations or outreach activities
- Facilitating engagement with specific non-academic communities, for example local schools and colleges, patient groups, community groups, societies and University of the Third Age
- Helping researchers to make use of social media in communicating with the public
