

You are welcome to walk around Glasney Parc **9**. Unfortunately, it's not possible for visitors to enter the residences without prior permission from the Accommodation Office. The two and three storey buildings in Glasney Parc are divided into self-catered flats, each with seven en-suite rooms and a fully-equipped kitchen. There is a virtual tour available at [www.exeter.ac.uk/virtualtours](http://www.exeter.ac.uk/virtualtours)

You may also wish to view the **MUGA** (Multi-Use Games Area) **10**; a flood-lit pitch used for team sports. The Students' Union (FXU) hosts a wide range of student sports clubs who can make use of the MUGA, including rugby, football, netball and hockey.

From the Porter's Lodge, return to the Peter Lanyon Building, cross the courtyard and walk back under the archway. Follow the path back up the hill, and midway up the steps, take the path to your left.

The path leads up to **Tremough House** **11**, from which the campus takes its name. This houses the **English Department**.

Take the steps to the left of Tremough House, into the **Italian Gardens**. Follow the steps opposite to the top of the gardens. Turn right and you'll see some steps opposite leading up through the Daphne Du Maurier Building. Follow these, walk across the courtyard, and you'll find yourself back by the **main reception**.

## Start at the **main reception** 1

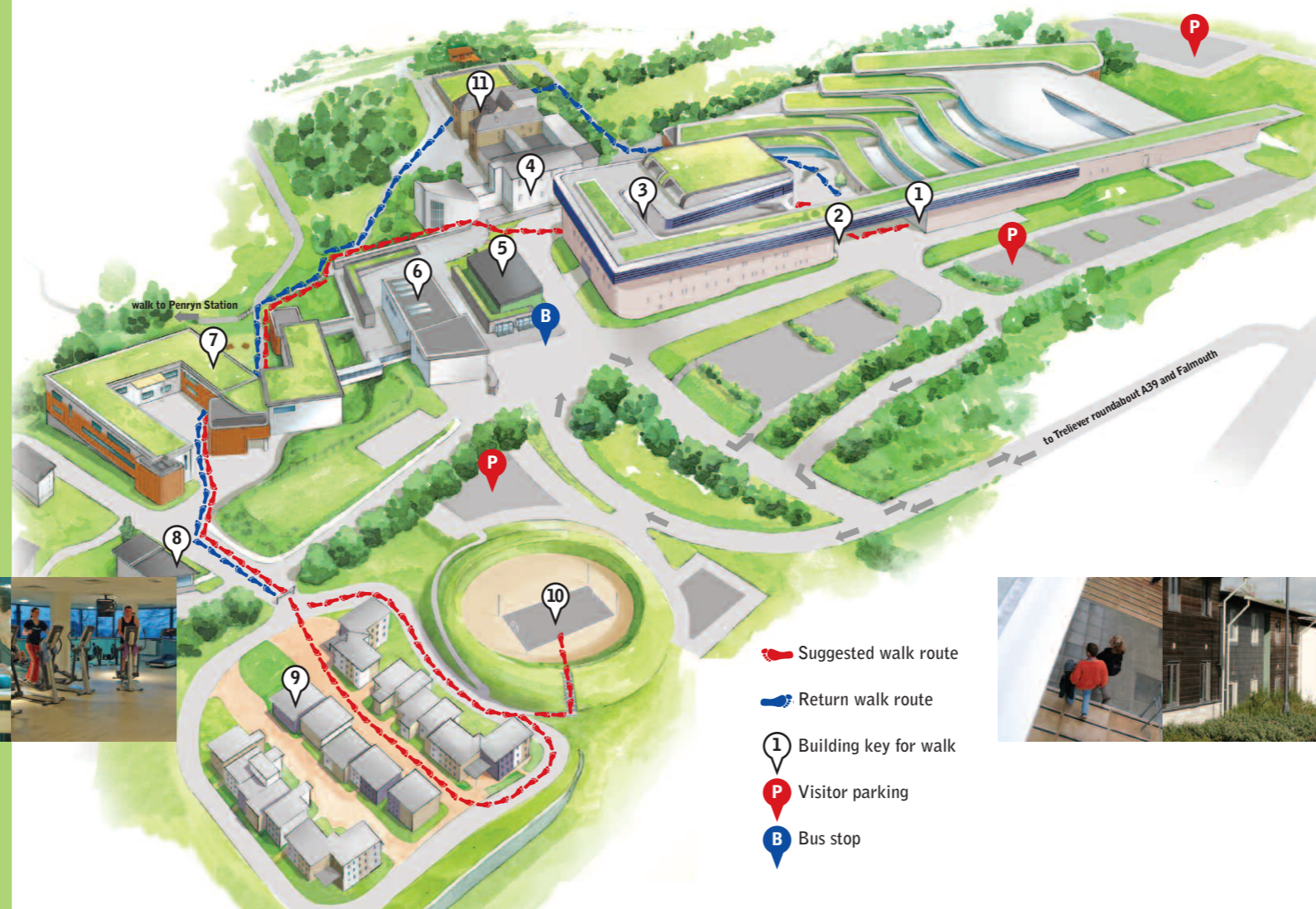
The building around you is the **Daphne du Maurier Building** which houses many of the campus facilities as well as the **Biology Department** and **Camborne School of Mines**.

With your back to reception, you'll see the entrance to the **Learning Resources Centre** 2. This comprises the campus library and IT facilities which you are welcome to look around if you wish. You'll find the **main library collections** on the ground floor and the **IT suite and Law Library** downstairs. *Staff at the library reception desk will be happy to answer your questions about the facilities and services on offer.*

After leaving the LRC, take the steps down to your left. Above and on your right is the **main lecture theatre and seminar room space**.

At the bottom of the steps turn right. On your left-hand side are steps up to the **campus bar** and down to the **Refectory**. The bar and refectory are collectively known as **The Stannary** 3, and at night convert into a 1,000-capacity venue, which regularly plays host to live bands, comedy and club nights.

On your right-hand side you'll see steps up to the **Sports Centre**, with its fully-equipped, air-conditioned gym and exercise studio. The Centre runs a wide range of classes including yoga, pilates, circuits, capoeira, belly dancing and street dance. *You are welcome to go inside. Please ask if a member of staff is available to show you around.*

From the Sports Centre, go down the steps to the side of the refectory. On the left you can see through the windows into the refectory.

To your right is **The Annexe** 4, which houses the Students' Union (FXU), Community Action Office, Accommodation Office, Careers Advisory Service, Counselling Service and the Health Service.

Continue straight ahead and you'll see the **Tremough Shop** 5 to your left. The campus bus stop sits just behind the shop. The **Media Centre** 6 can be seen in front of you. Turn right, take the path to the steps and continue right to the bottom.

As you walk down the steps you have views across Penryn. Turn left at the bottom of the steps. The Media Centre is now on your left and the **Peter Lanyon building** 7 on your right.

Follow the path to walk under the archway and you'll find yourself in a courtyard. This part of the building houses the **Geography Department**, the **Academic Support Unit**, the **School of Humanities and Social Sciences** and the **School of Law**.

Walk across to the far left corner of the courtyard and turn left up the road. To your right is the **Porter's Lodge** 8 which offers a point of contact for the students in **Glasney Parc** 9 residences.
