



Assessment for Specific Learning Differences

If you have been advised to book an assessment for a specific learning difference/difficulty, such as dyslexia, you can choose to book the assessment with an educational psychologist or specialist teacher.

Specialist teachers should have a Postgraduate Diploma in Specific Learning Difficulties and an assessment Practising Certificate. Educational psychologists should have current HCPC registration.
