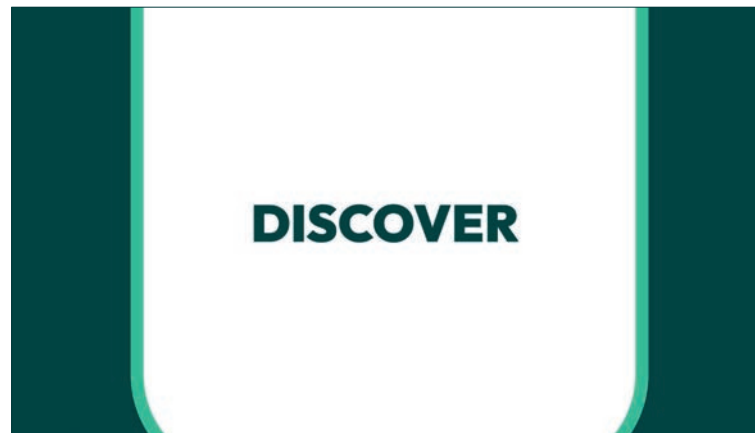
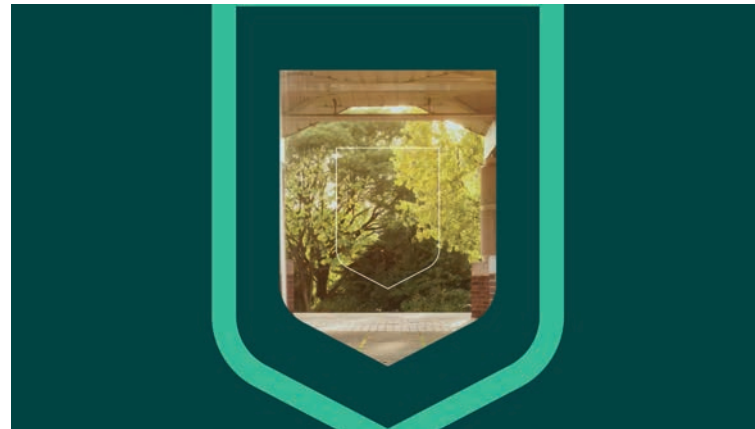
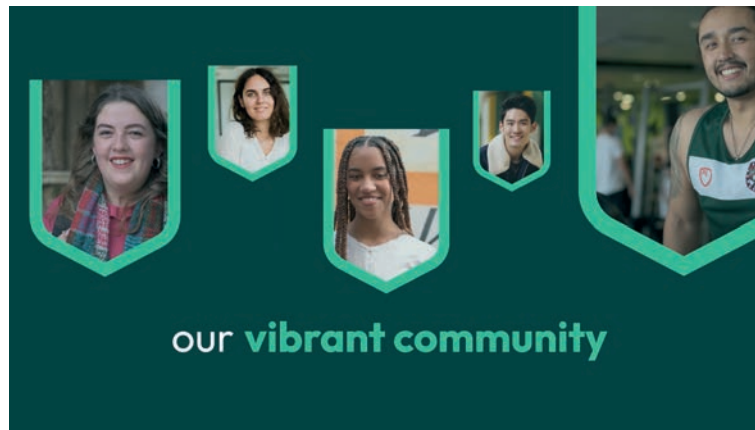


This anthology demonstrates the university's vision and commitment to use the power of creativity, interdisciplinary, and collaborations to tackle global challenges.

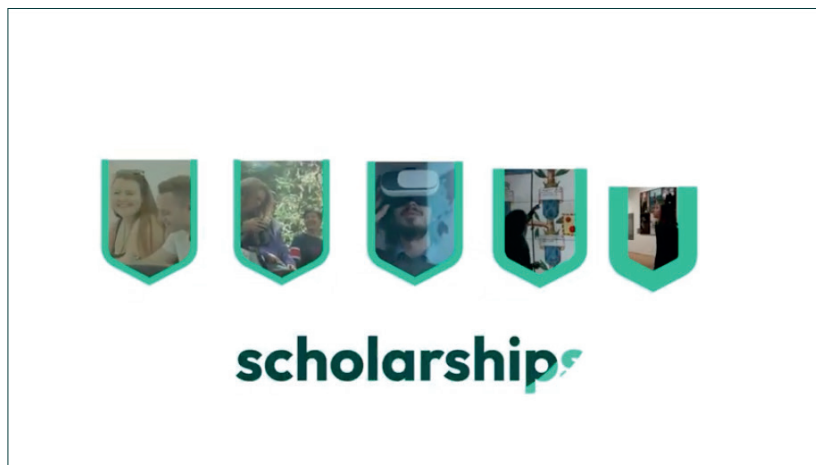

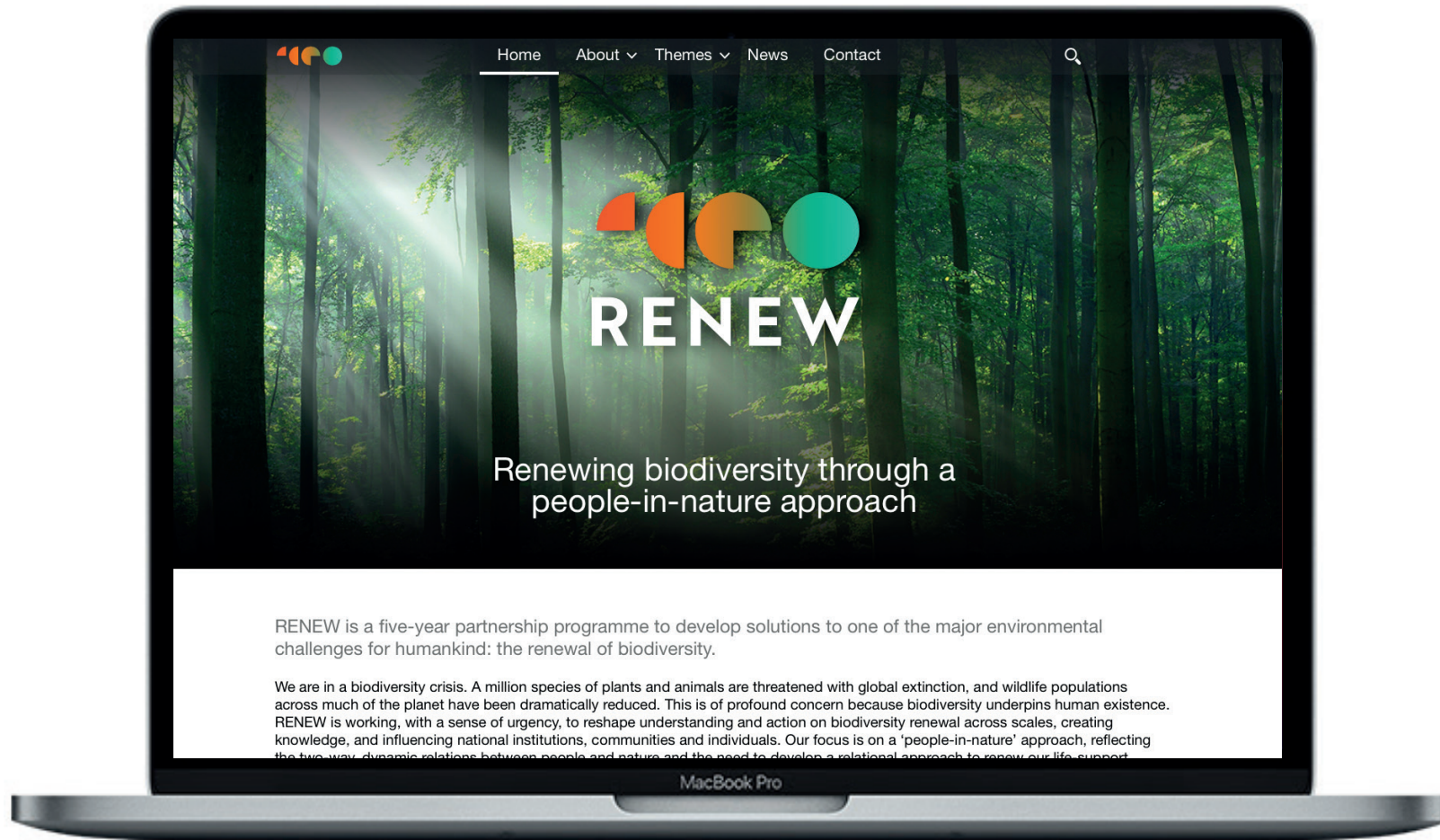

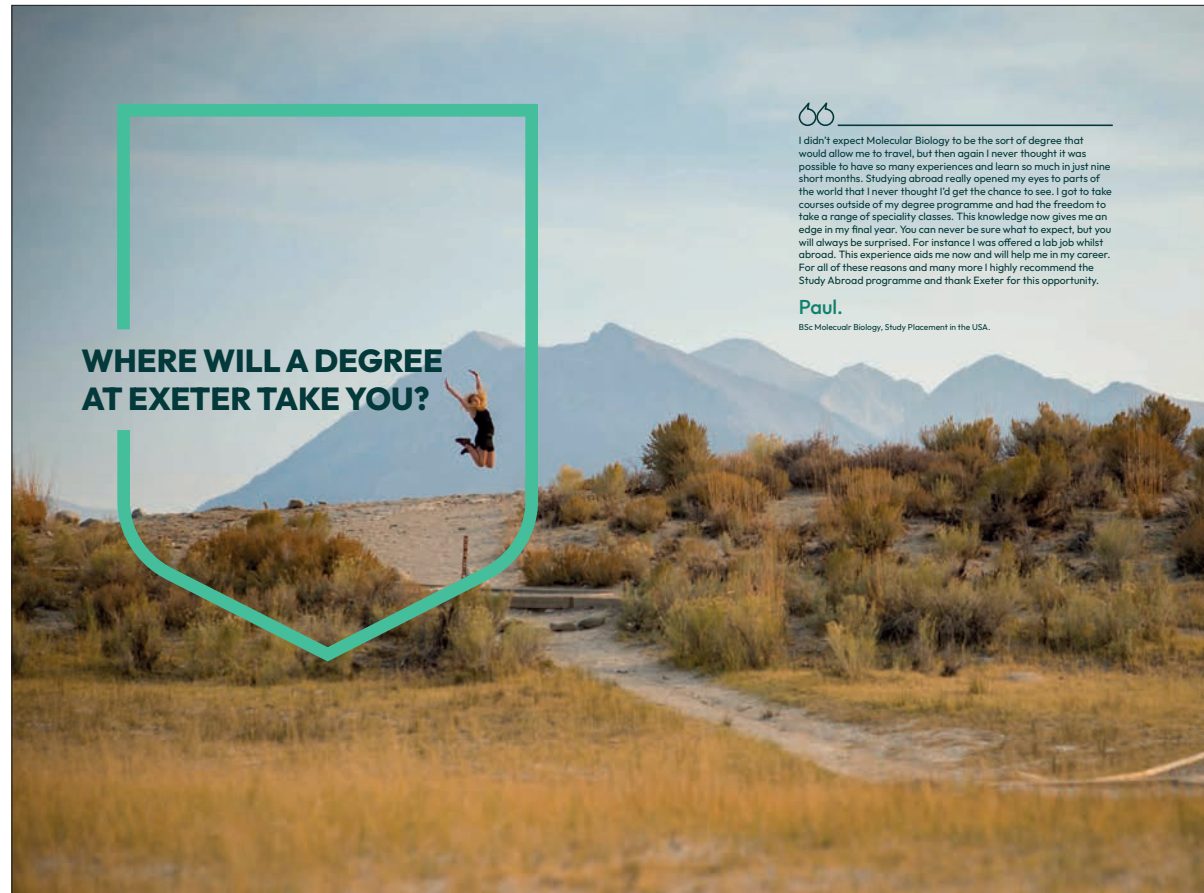

About the University of Exeter

The University of Exeter combines world-class research and education with an outstanding student experience. We welcome over 30,000 students from more than 150 countries to our four campuses: Streatham and St Luke's in Exeter, Devon, and Penryn and Truro in Cornwall. Our success is built upon strong foundations of leadership, governance and management, and a sector-leading partnership with our students. We have University-wide institutes and research groups that are highly interdisciplinary. While we are one community, each campus has its own unique identity.

Formed in 1955, we are a member of the Russell Group, which comprises the UK's leading research-intensive universities. We are proud of our achievements but we remain ambitious for the future. The University of Exeter has gone from strength to strength becoming the UK's fastest rising research university over the past decade.

Infrastructure investments in support of interdisciplinary research include the establishment of our four Research Institutes: the Environment and Sustainability Institute; Global Systems Institute; the Institute for Data Science and Artificial Intelligence; the Living Systems Institute and the recent development of a new Societies and Cultures Institute.

- The Research Excellence Framework (REF) 2021 review showed that we are doing more research, of better quality, with a bigger impact on the world than ever before. Our world-leading research impact grew more than any other Russell Group university, more than 99 per cent of our research was rated of international quality¹ and 12 of our subjects were in the Top 10 for world-leading impact.²

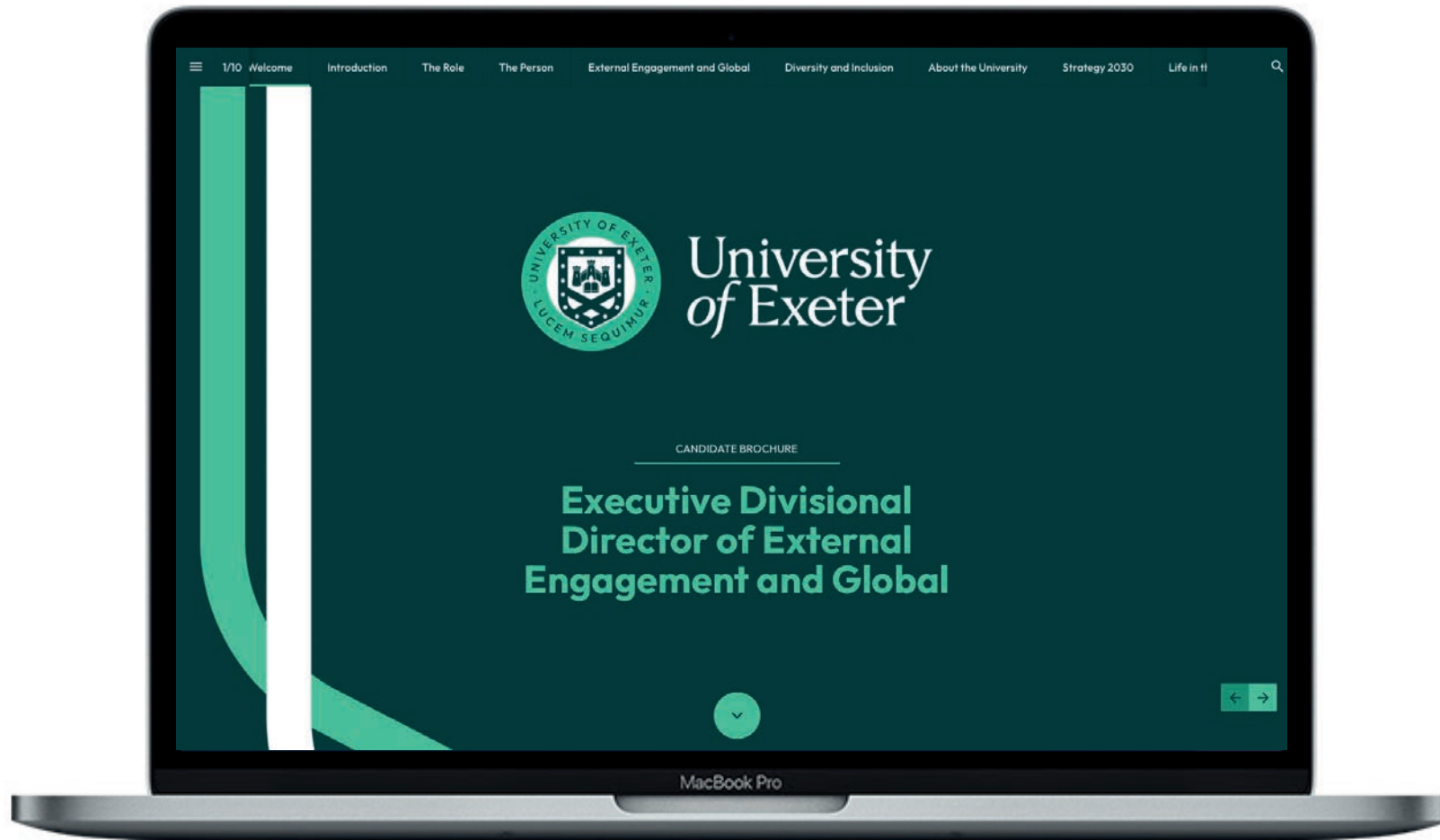

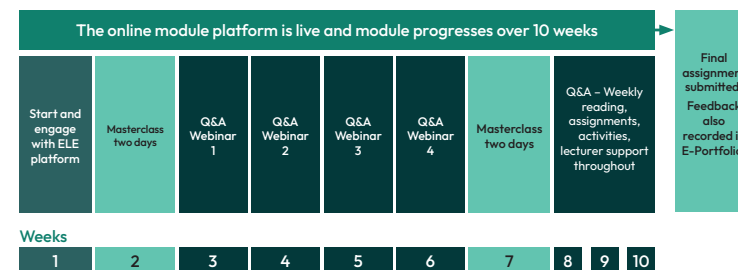
Programme Structure

Typical Module Structure








Timeline of understanding infection

- 1346-53 The Black Death Plague!**
Caused by the bacterium *Yersinia pestis*. It was a devastating and highly contagious disease that killed up to 100 million people. It was the first time that people were shown to be carrying a disease organism. It was also the first time that people were shown to be carrying a disease organism. - 1829 The first recorded case of aspergillosis infection in evolutionary Paris, France**
- 1890s - 1910s Paul Ehrlich and the "Magic Bullet"**
Ehrlich's discovery of the "magic bullet" was a major breakthrough in the treatment of infectious diseases. He discovered that certain dyes could target specific bacteria, leading to the development of the first synthetic antibiotic, salvarsan.
- 1928 The Founding Father of Microbiology!**
Louis Pasteur is considered the "founder" of microbiology. He discovered that microorganisms cause fermentation and disease, and he developed the process of pasteurization to kill harmful bacteria in food and drink.
- 1861a Louis Pasteur vs. Robert Koch**
Pasteur's work showed that the disease-causing agent was a bacterium, not a "vital force" as some scientists believed. Koch's work established the "germ theory" of disease, showing that specific bacteria cause specific diseases.
- 1928-1960s The first anti-fungal medicine**
The first anti-fungal medicine, nystatin, was discovered in 1951. It is a polyene antifungal that binds to ergosterol in the cell membrane of fungi, causing cell leakage and death.
- 1929 A new anti-fungal medicine is approved!**
Penicillin was discovered in 1928 by Alexander Fleming. It is a natural product of the fungus *Penicillium notatum*. It is effective against many types of bacteria, but not against fungi.
- 2009 Discovery of Candida auris**
Candida auris is a multidrug-resistant yeast that has emerged as a global health threat. It is often found in the ears, nose, and throat of patients in hospitals, and it can cause serious infections.

Fungal infections

- Cryptococcus**
Cryptococcus is a genus of fungi that can cause serious infections in humans. It is often found in the lungs, but it can also spread to other parts of the body, such as the brain and spinal cord.
- Candida**
Candida is a genus of fungi that can cause a variety of infections in humans. It is often found in the mouth, throat, and vagina, but it can also cause serious infections in the lungs and other parts of the body.
- Aspergillus**
Aspergillus is a genus of fungi that can cause a variety of infections in humans. It is often found in the lungs, but it can also spread to other parts of the body, such as the brain and spinal cord.
- Pneumocystis**
Pneumocystis is a genus of fungi that can cause a serious lung infection in humans. It is often found in the lungs of people with weakened immune systems.

What are antifungals?

Antifungals are "magic bullets" that either kill or stop the growth of fungi. They are used to treat a variety of fungal infections, including athlete's foot, ringworm, and candidiasis.

How do Antifungals work: The Lock and Key Cycle

1. The antifungal binds to the target site on the fungus.
2. The antifungal blocks the target site, preventing the fungus from growing.
3. The fungus dies.

Types of Antifungals

1. Polyenes (e.g., nystatin)
2. Azoles (e.g., fluconazole)
3. Echinocandins (e.g., caspofungin)
4. Amphotericin B

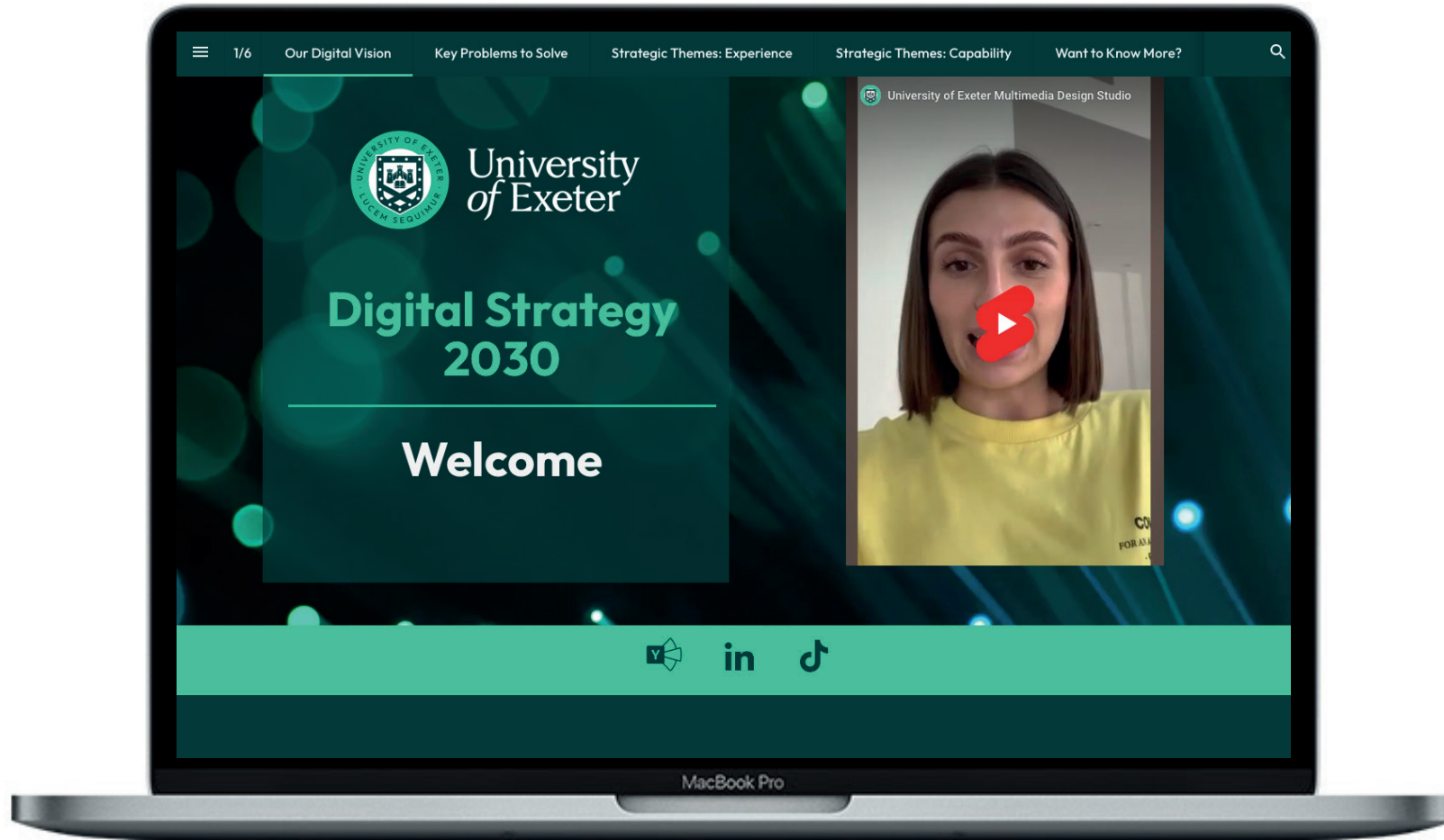
