

# Committed to our community

After a busy summer season, Falmouth University and the University of Exeter in Cornwall are aware of the pressures on the community. As our academic year begins back on campus we are committed to working together to keep each other safe and reduce the transmission of Covid-19.

Peter Cox, Falmouth University Chief Operating Officer, explained, "Both universities have developed rigourous plans with our campus partners to ensure we safely manage a return to on-campus activities and the delivery of as much teaching on campus as possible in this new academic year. We aim to do this, while also making sure we are able to respond to any potential resurgence of Covid-19."



"We will continue to support students with quarantine, self-isolation and where necessary, remote study, as well as encouraging the take up of vaccinations and regular testing."

In addition, the University of Exeter and Falmouth University, along with Falmouth Town Council, are helping to fund two night time marshals to help support positive behaviours in the community in the evenings. The marshals will conduct five-hour patrols of the town's streets from Thursday to Sunday every week until the end of October.

Amie Fulton, Director of Cornwall Operations at the University of Exeter, said, "Throughout the pandemic, our first priority has always been the safety and wellbeing of our students, staff and the communities we are part of. For this reason, in addition to the testing we've been offering since last September, the two universities have agreed to co-fund the marshals in Falmouth so that guidance and support could be provided to all those socialising in town at night.

"We have received good feedback about this scheme and are proud to be playing our part in helping combat the spread of Covid-19 within our community."

## Student wins award for his volunteering work

Jordan Pidwell, a Geography student at the University of Exeter, was presented with the Community Award and the 'winner of winners' Daniel Palmer Award at this year's SU Awards.

Jordan, who has volunteered as a Beaver Scout leader for almost six years, delivered a virtual programme for Scouts across the Truro District during the pandemic so that they wouldn't miss out on any activities, and was recently appointed as the County Youth Commissioner for Cornwall Scouts. He's also helped to raise more than £5,000 for Children's Hospice South West.

## Transforming green deserts into wildlife-friendly spaces

The Making Space for Nature project has been praised for its work transforming recreation grounds, parks, verges and closed churchyards into havens for bees, butterflies, birds and hedgehogs in seven towns across Cornwall, including Falmouth and Penryn.

The project, run by the University of Exeter and Cornwall Council, was recently audited against the national Building with Nature standards – a new benchmark for green infrastructure – and was accredited with the highest level.
