## **Our Coat of Arms**



Our Coat of Arms, or Crest, symbolises the historical associations of the University with our locality.





The triangular gold castle with three towers comes from Exeter's coat of arms and is thought to represent Rougemont Castle as alluded to by the red background.



The green cross on a white background is from Devon County Council's coat of arms.



The 15 gold bezants around the edge of the shield are from Cornwall's coat of arms, symbolizing the ransom paid by the people of Cornwall to free the Duke of Cornwall.



The theme of learning is symbolised by the book with gold edges and a Latin inscription translating roughly as "We follow the light", our motto.
