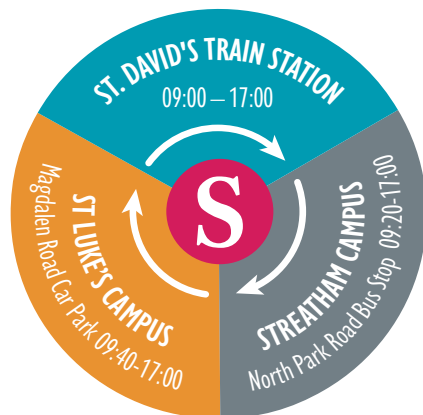
There are general information marquees at both campuses where staff will be delighted to deal with any enquiries you may have. ## BETWEEN CAMPUSES AND ST. DAVID'S TRAIN STATION

**P** Please note there is no unauthorised parking available on the campuses. Parking is restricted to pre-booked permit holders and Blue Badge holders only.

A free University of Exeter mini bus service **S** will run between St. David's Train Station, Streatham campus and St. Luke's campus and reverse through out the day. Buses will depart each location on the hour, 20mins past the hour and 20mins to the hour. Upon boarding the minibus please indicate to the driver which location you would like.

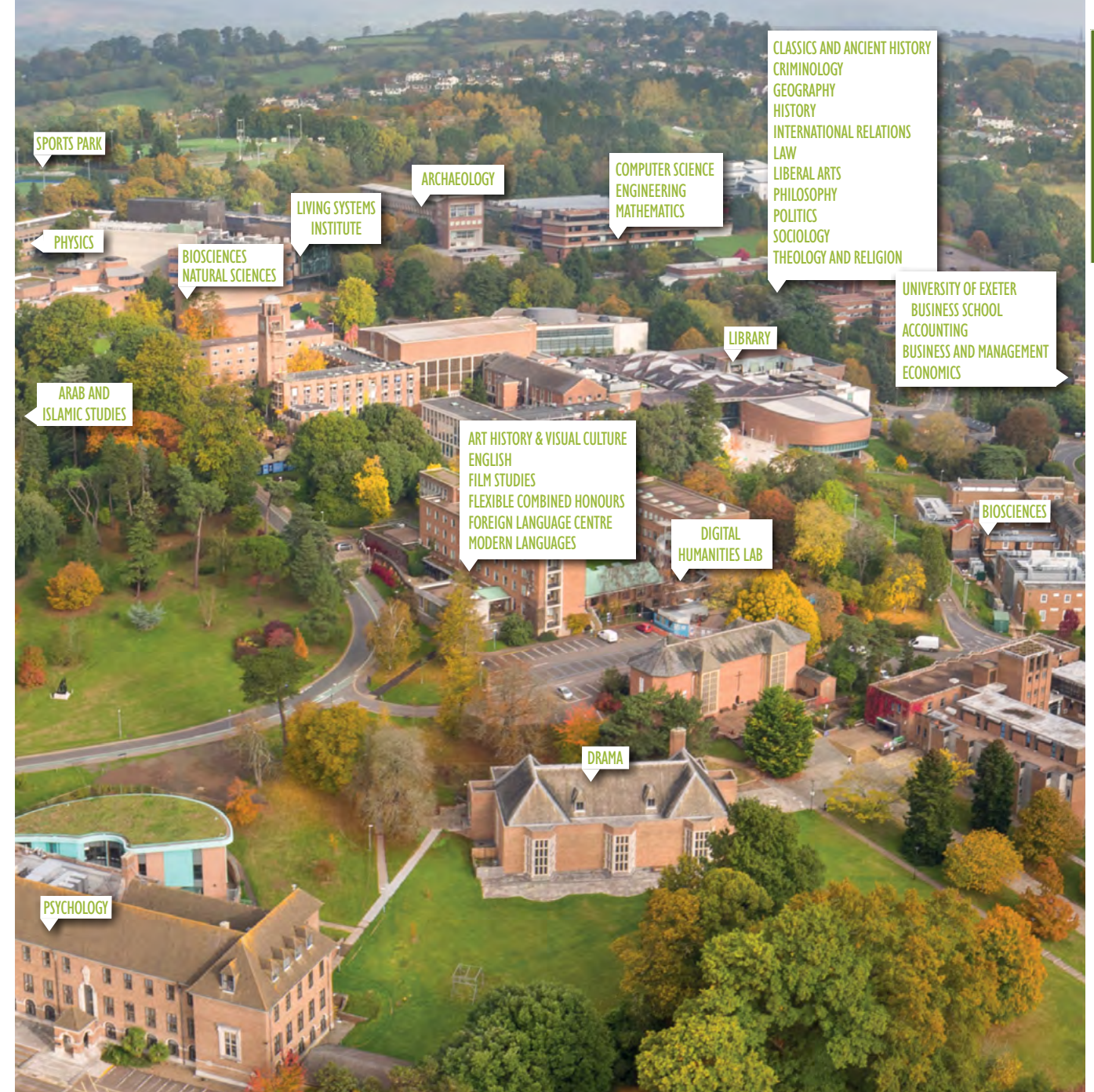
## VISITING EXETER CITY CENTRE

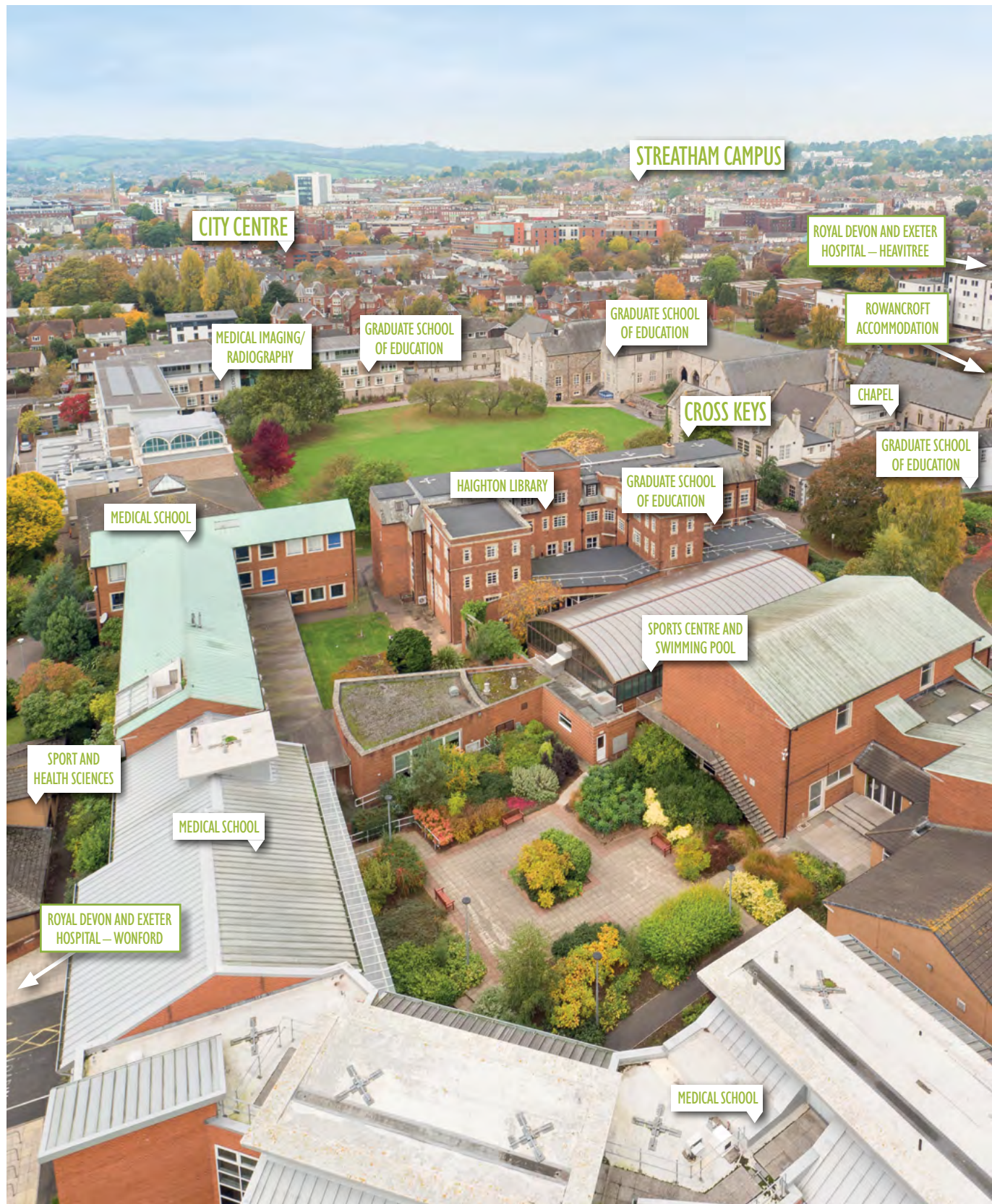


## STREATHAM CAMPUS >>

## ST LUKE'S CAMPUS >>

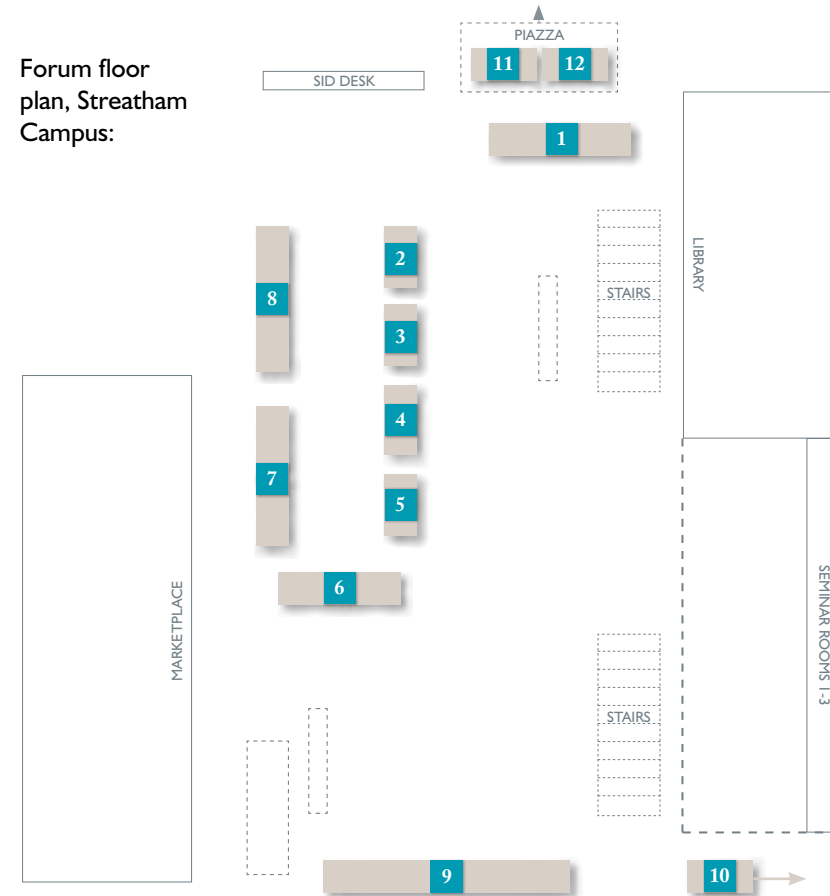

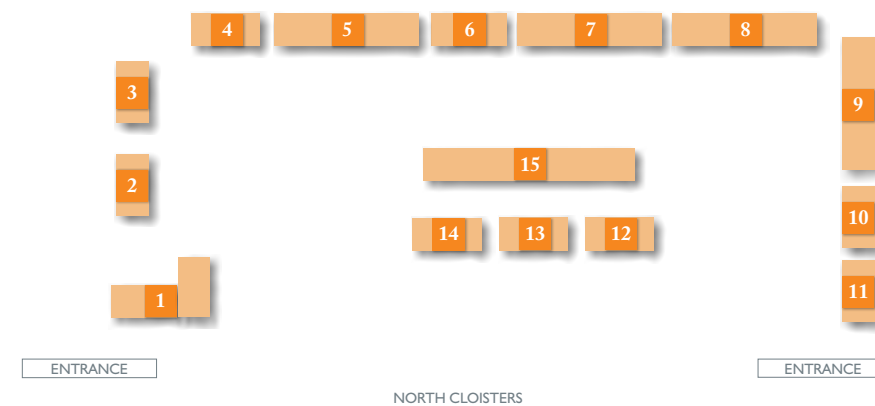

## SELF-GUIDED ACCOMMODATION TOURS

During the Open Day you will be able to view some examples of the accommodation available to undergraduate students. You will need to make your own way to the residences which are open for viewing. Our student ambassadors will be showing groups of visitors around the accommodation and you will have the opportunity to chat to them about their experience of living in student residences.

As you will not have time to visit all of the residences, we recommend you choose one or two different types of accommodation as these will be representative of what we offer. Our advisors on the Accommodation stands will be pleased to provide you with more specific information.

### Room types

We have a range of accommodation styles, standards and budgets to suit your needs. The different types of rooms are:

- **Standard** – some rooms have washbasins with bathroom facilities being shared with other residents. We offer a range of standard accommodation with some located in traditional residences and others in more modern buildings with recently updated fixtures and fittings.
- **En-suite** – rooms have a private shower, washbasin and toilet.
- **Studio** – individual flats which have a private shower, washbasin and toilet and small kitchen area.

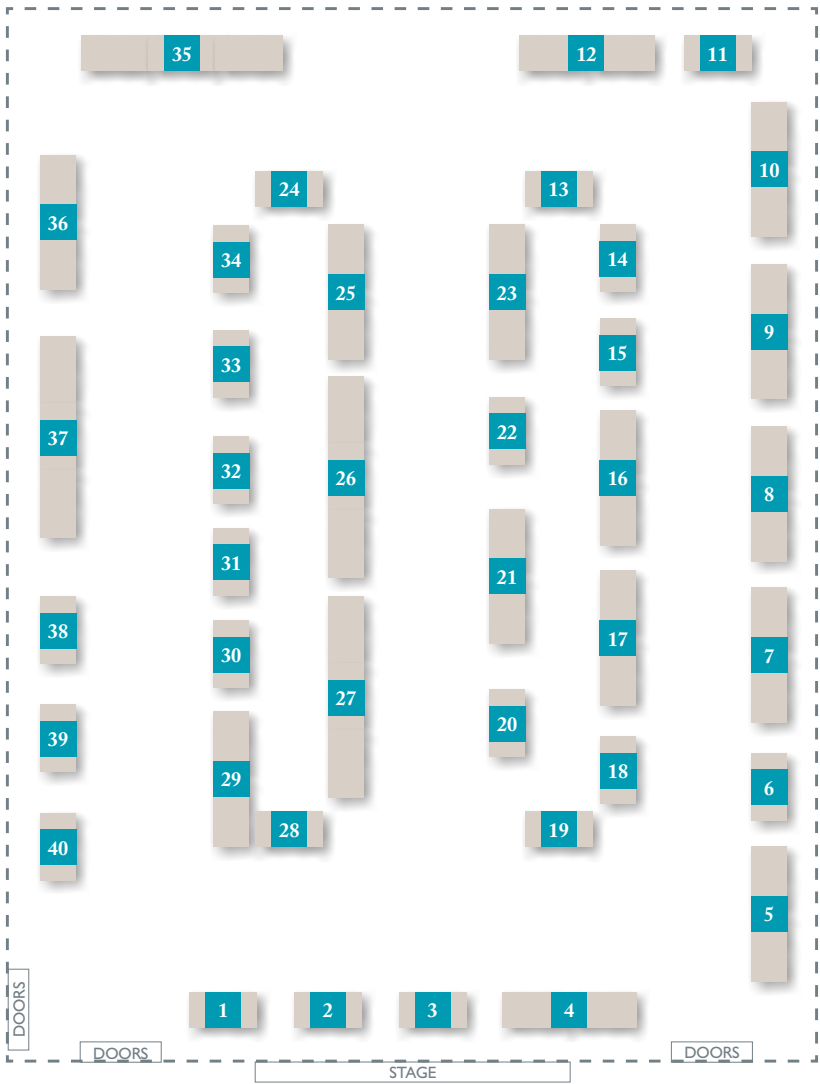

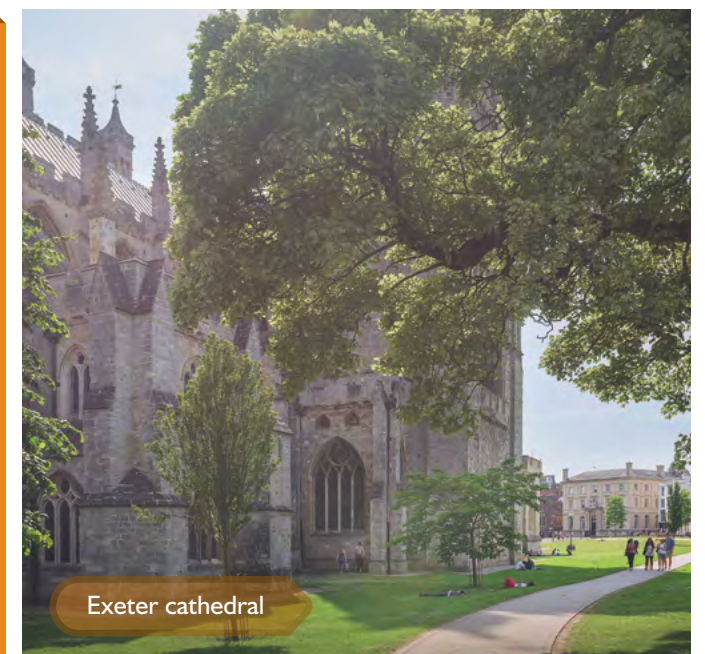
