

## India Vlogger Scholarship Terms and Conditions for the Competition

By entering the University of Exeter's India Vlogger Scholarship Competition you accept the rules of the Competition as outlined below.

1. Under the Competition, the University of Exeter ("the University") is awarding to the winning entrant a one off £7,000 tuition fee scholarship for the first year of study at the University as well as the role of the University's India Student Vlogger, creating vlogs about University life at Exeter ("the Prize"). There will also be a second place prize of £2,000 and a third place prize of £1,000 first-year tuition fee scholarship.
2. The Winner is able to claim a scholarship of £7,000 in the form of a discount of £7,000 off the price of first year International Tuition Fees in relation to their undergraduate course of study ("the Scholarship"). The second and third place ("runners up") will be able to claim a discount of £2,000 and £1,000 respectively, applied to their first-year tuition fee.
3. In order to enter the Competition and be considered for the Prizes, we are asking entrants to submit via [india@exeter.ac.uk](mailto:india@exeter.ac.uk) an original vlog that you have created and produced yourself, and in line with the brief outlined on the Competition page [here](#) ("the Brief").
4. The University will accept Competition entries from 30 April 2021 until midnight on 30 May 2021 ("the Closing Date").
5. Only one entry will be counted per person; if you submit more than one entry we will accept the first entry only that we receive from you and discard your remaining entries.
6. To be eligible to enter the Competition, you must be 18 years of age or over at the point you would be registering to be a Undergraduate, you must be a current resident of India who is eligible to study at the University in the 2021/22 Academic Year, and you must already be in receipt of an offer to study an undergraduate programme at the University.
7. The Competition is not open to anyone who is not an Indian resident, or who is an Indian Resident and current a student at the University of Exeter, or INTO Exeter.
8. The process that the University's International Student Recruitment Team will take to select the winner of the Prizes ("the Winner" and "the runners up") will consist of two stages. The first stage will be a shortlisting exercise undertaken by a member of the International Student Recruitment Team, who will review all of the Competition entries and will shortlist no more than 5 entrants ("Shortlisted Entrants").
9. Shortlisted Entrants may then be invited by email to a video interview, with members of the International Student Recruitment Team. The purpose of this interview will be to determine the originality of each of the Shortlisted Entrant's vlog, and the Shortlisted Entrant's suitability to take on the role of the University's India Student Vlogger. Based on the Shortlisted Entrants' vlog and any such interview, the International Student Recruitment Team will select one Winner, and the second and third place runners up.
10. The Winner and the second and third place runners up will also be contacted via email by the end of June 2021 with further details of next steps. All Shortlisted Entrants will be informed of the outcome of their entries by email. The Winner and the second and third place runners up will be announced at the beginning of July 2021 through the University's website [here](#).
11. All non-shortlisted entrants will not be contacted further, and are not entitled to any feedback on their Competition entries.

12. The Winner and the runners up, remain liable for all of the outstanding tuition fees not covered by the scholarship part of the Prize, as well as all accommodation, maintenance and other related expenditure incurred by them whilst studying at the University.
13. In addition, the scholarships are only applicable for the first year of study. After the first year of study the Winner and the runners up will be liable for the full international student fee for each academic year remaining of their programme.
14. In order to remain eligible for their Prize the Winner and the runners up must have also registered to study at the University by **no later than week three of the first term**. Failure to abide by this condition may result in the Prize being withdrawn unless a later registration date has been agreed with the International Student Recruitment Team.
15. In entering the Competition, you promise that all information submitted by you is true, accurate and complete and your Competition vlog is original and entirely your own work. The University of Exeter reserves the right to verify any information contained in your entry and/or your eligibility to enter the Competition at any point during the Competition or at any point after the Closing Date.
16. The University reserves the right to disqualify an entrant, runner up or the Winner where it is found that person has provided inaccurate or false information or is ineligible to enter the Competition. Competition entries that do not match the Brief or are received into the Competition inbox after the Closing Date will also be disqualified. For the avoidance of any doubt, if the Winner is disqualified, or is in anyway unable to take enrol with the University in September, the University reserves the right to award the Prize to one of the runners up.
17. If the University reasonably suspects during the selection process that professional assistance or equipment has been given to any Competition entrant, or that their entry is not original or not their entirely their own work, then the Competition entrant will be disqualified.
18. The University acknowledges that copyright in each Competition vlog is owned by the Competition entrant. By submitting a Competition vlog to the University, each Competition entrant grants the University a non-exclusive, royalty-free licence to use the copyright and any other intellectual property right and performer's rights subsisting in the Competition vlog for the purpose of selecting the Winner only. Should the University wish to feature any of the Competition vlogs, other than the Winner's Competition vlog, on any social media or other platform, the University will contact the Competition entrant and ask for their consent to do so.
19. The Winner and runners up will each be required to enter into a contract with the University which can be viewed [here](#), setting out further information about the Prize, more specifically terms and conditions about the Scholarship and the role of the University's India Student Vlogger. The terms of the contract are non-negotiable and require granting the University a non-exclusive, royalty-free, perpetual and irrevocable licence to use the copyright and any other intellectual property right and performer's rights subsisting in the Winner's or runner up's Competition vlog for the purposes of publishing, displaying, disseminating and generally making it available to the public in any format and on any platform.
20. The Prizes are non-transferable and no part of the Prizes are exchangeable for cash or any other prize.

21. The University reserves the right to change the Closing Date or stop the Competition at any time without prior notice, however such changes will only be where the University is forced to do so for reasons outside of its reasonable control and any such changes will be identified on the Competition webpage [here](#).
22. The University reserves the right to amend these rules at any time. If amendments are made to the rules, the University of Exeter will publish the amended Competition rules and/or specific Competition rules on Competition webpage [here](#).
23. The Competition is governed by English Law; any disputes regarding this Competition will be resolved in accordance with the law of England and Wales and through the English courts.
