

- Today we're a member of the Russell Group, recognised for both our research and teaching excellence.


















Excellence in education

I'm a bit like an environmental detective, investigating relationships between humans and the environment, or looking <u>for evidence of environmental</u> change.

I am pioneering new techniques to find environmental 'tracers' in a range of different samples, and I've been involved in lots of exciting projects. These include classifying biomarkers in ice cores from Antarctica, identifying microparticles and plastics in fatbergs, reconstructing air pollution histories in Chinese megacities and characterising the growth of microorganisms for biofuels research.

I fell in love with research whilst completing my undergraduate dissertation project – a key moment that has shaped my career as a Postdoctoral Research Fellow. An important part of my research has been to assess how air pollution has changed since the Industrial Revolution in Merseyside using records from urban ponds. I have seen first-hand the impact humans have on air quality, and how there has been a sharp rise in pollution from fossil fuels over the last few decades.

My research has made me passionate about reducing my own personal environmental impact and I now live in a tiny off-grid house with my family. A firm supporter of the current social movement for climate action, I'm proud to work here. The University has declared a climate emergency and is committed to protecting the environment for all our futures.

Graduate Route

The UK Government has announced that it will introduce the Graduate Route from the summer of 2021. From this time, students holding a valid Tier 4 Visa (also known as a Student Visa), who have completed a degree at undergraduate level or above at a UK Higher Education Provider, will be able to remain in the UK and work, or look for work, for two years after they complete their studies. Supporting you

English language support from INTO University of Exeter

If you need to improve your English to meet our entry requirements, you can enrol on an English language preparation course delivered by INTO University of Exeter on the Streatham Campus. Taught by experienced tutors, who understand the international student experience, our Pre-Sessional courses provide intensive preparation in academic English for students over a six-, ten- or eighteen-week period starting in July, June or April.

INTO also offers Academic English and has regular intakes throughout the year, so it's suitable for students wanting to enrol at other points in the year or who need longer to enhance their skills.

The Exeter International Graduate Diploma programme has been created to develop your study skills and English ability as well as to enhance your subject knowledge. Our range of optional modules enables you to further develop your subject knowledge or explore new areas.

Our programme (subject to achieving the specific entry grades) provides you with the opportunity to progress to more than 30 postgraduate degrees including: Financial Analysis and Fund Management; International Education; Digital Marketing; Accounting and Finance; Entrepreneurship and Innovation Management; Applied Data Science and Management at the University of Exeter.

- All-inclusive fees covering all utilities, wifi and contents insurance.





Your PhD applicant journey

Follow either of the two routes outlined to understand how to go about identifying and applying for the right PhD. As a general rule, funded PhD projects tend to be more readily available in STEMM (science, technology, engineering, maths and medicine) subjects.

'I'd like to do a PhD!'

Search for potential PhD projects based on your interests and circumstances at exeter.ac.uk/phdprojects

Contact the supervisor(s) listed on the project advert to discuss your application.

Prepare your CV, transcripts and cover letter in advance of the deadline.

Narrow down your subject area of interest to a novel question and create a draft research proposal¹.

Identify staff who share similar research interests. Contact them to discuss your research proposal and request supervision.

Refine and finalise your research proposal¹. Prepare your CV, transcripts and cover letter.

Fees, funding and scholarships

When planning how to fund your postgraduate degree, make sure you start early and think creatively; the sooner you do, the longer you have to research opportunities and get funds together. Alongside your tuition fees you will need to account for living costs and accommodation, as well as other potential course costs.

University of Exeter Global Excellence Scholarships¹

Our Global Excellence Scholarships of at least £5,000 are available for international fee paying students applying to study a Taught Masters with us in September 2023, and will be awarded for outstanding academic quality.

As scholarships will be awarded from the beginning of the application cycle, we encourage an early application to ensure you are considered before all funds are allocated.



What is a PhD research proposal?

If you're applying to one of our PhD programmes, you will be required to submit a research proposal.

Your research proposal should leave a positive first impression about your 'fitness' to study a PhD. It needs to demonstrate that you are capable of independent critical thinking and analysis and can clearly communicate your ideas. There are six key elements you should include:

- A clear working title.
- A clear statement about what you want to work on and why it is important, interesting, relevant and realistic.
- Some background knowledge and context of the area in which you wish to work, include key literature people and research findings.
- Some consideration of the methods/ approach you might use.
- Some indication of the strategy and timetable for your project and any anticipated challenges.
- A list of the key references which support your research proposal.
