



Access to Internships (A2I)

- provides support and funding to help eligible students arrange a paid internship in the UK 80 or 140 hours (4 weeks).
- students can apply for one employer subsidy and one 'Help Getting to Work' bursary, per year.
- 3 different types of funding:
 - University of Exeter Internship (with an Academic or Professional Service) - £14.12 an hour
 - b. SME (less than 250 employees), Charity or Statutory Organisation £12.60 an hour
 - c. 'Help Getting to Work' Bursary up to £250


