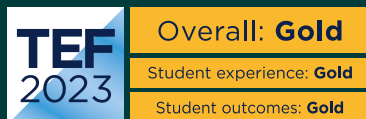

Self-directed learning	Private reading, informal discussion groups and other forms of self-directed studying will make up a significant amount of your learning.



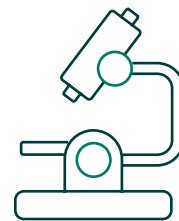

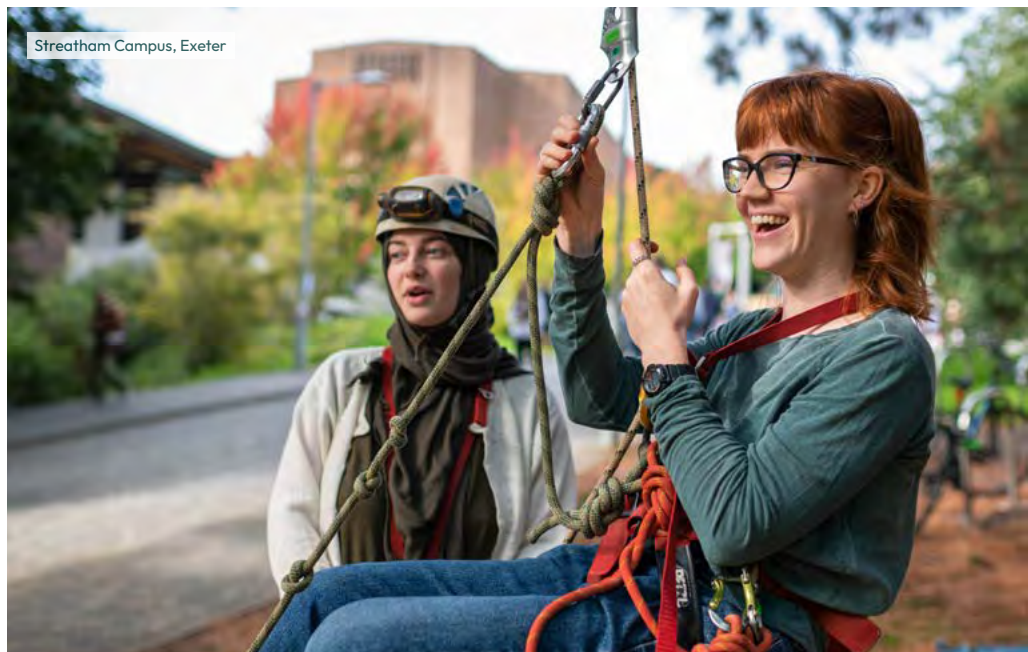
# YOUR STUDENTS' UNIONS

The Guild or the SU will open the door to many opportunities such as fun societies, student-led communities and important support services.



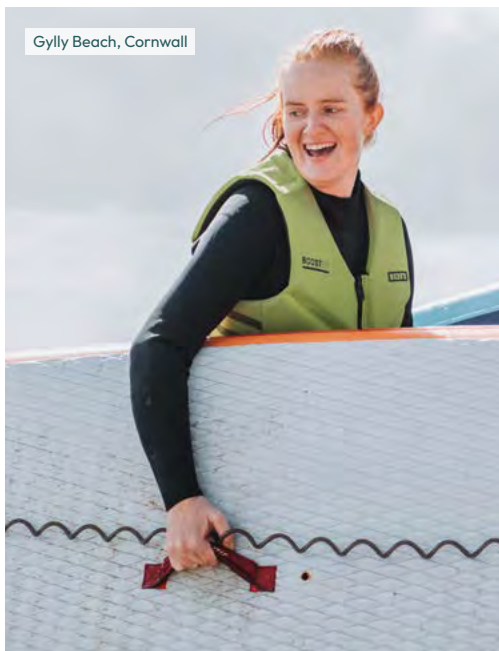

# FINANCE

## Fees

Tuition fees vary depending on your course and fee status. You can find the up-to-date international tuition fees for your course by scanning the QR code below.

Undergraduate international fees for 2025 entry are divided into the following bands:

Degrees	Cost per year
Arts, humanities, social sciences and business	£24,700 - £25,500
Science, technology, and mathematics	£29,800 - £30,900
Medicine	£47,500

Postgraduate international fees for 2025 entry vary by course, with the general range between £23,500 (programmes such as MA English Literary Studies) and £44,700 (programmes such as The Exeter MBA). Most postgraduate programmes are around £32,300.

Studying in the UK offers good value, with costs lower than the USA and Australia. International students without dependents can expect to spend around £900-£1,300 monthly on living expenses outside London, according to the British Council.
