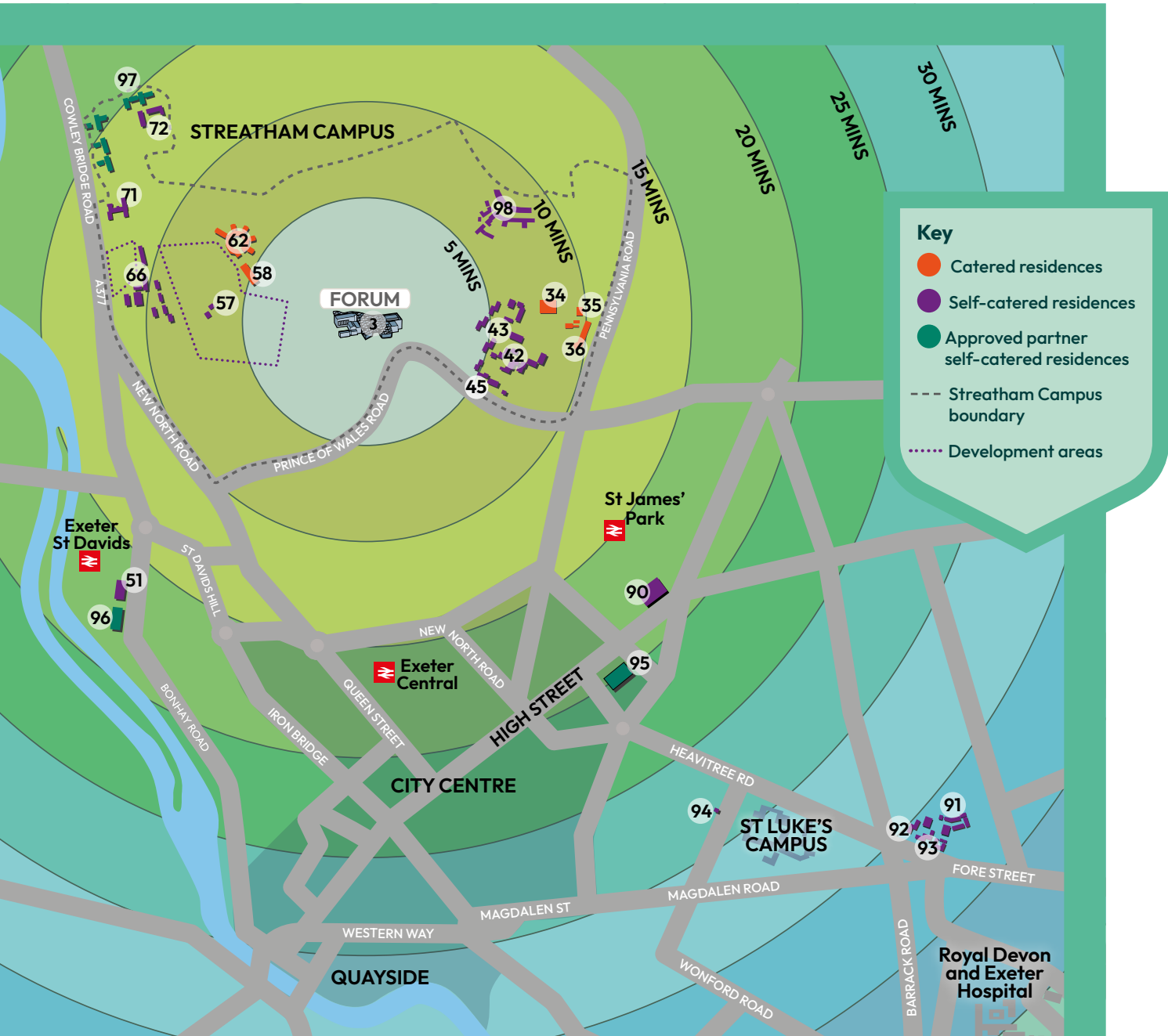

Welcome

Starting university is an exciting time and the living experience is a huge part of your university adventure.

Living in student accommodation enables you to meet a diverse range of people from different backgrounds and cultures, giving the opportunity to make friends and enjoy new experiences.

Each of our residences have their own distinctive character, providing a welcoming community and a safe and secure environment where you can socialise, study and relax.

We have a range of university-owned, managed or approved accommodation – either on Streatham campus or just a short walk, cycle or bus ride away within the city.

Our range of accommodation varies in style, size, standard and budget, so it's a good idea to **consider what's important to you:**

- **Locations** – On Streatham campus and in attractive locations around the historic, vibrant city of Exeter, operated either by the university or one of our carefully chosen approved partners.
- **Room types** – Self-contained studios, ensuite with your own bathroom or standard where you share bathroom facilities with others. We also have twin rooms for 2 students to share.
- **Catering basis** – Catered, including breakfast and dinner on weekdays and brunch and dinner at weekends, or self-catered if you'd prefer to cook for yourself.

Contract lengths and prices vary. With all-inclusive rents there's no additional bills to pay.

Top tips

1. Consider what matters most to you when applying for accommodation, but as many of our residences receive far more applications than we have rooms to offer, we encourage you to try and be open minded and flexible. We're not always able to allocate students to the residences they put on their application, but we do our best to offer an alternative that is of a similar style or standard.
2. Many students tell us that it's the people they meet, not the accommodation, who have truly enriched their living experience.

Our guarantee

New undergraduate students

If you apply for accommodation by **31 July 2026** we will guarantee to offer you a bed space if you are:

- An unaccompanied home or international undergraduate who has firmly accepted an offer of a place at the University of Exeter, entering your first year of study (i.e. Year 1) as a full-time student.
- An unaccompanied incoming study abroad or exchange student studying at the University of Exeter for the full academic year starting in September.

What matters most to you?

If you meet the criteria above, we guarantee to offer you accommodation. However, several of our residences, particularly those located on the Streatham campus, receive far more applications than we have rooms to offer, so this offer might not be for one of your application preferences. If this happens, we'll use the answers in your accommodation application to guide us in finding an alternative residence, so consider carefully what factor matters most to you. Is it the room type, location or catering basis, or do you need something of a similar cost? You'll find this question within the accommodation application.

For example, if your preferences were for en-suite residences and you tell us that room type is the most important, we may offer you an en-suite or studio room in an alternative available residence.



Insurance or Clearing Students

Most of our University-allocated accommodation is offered to students who apply within the guarantee deadline. After this date, any remaining accommodation is likely to be very limited and primarily located in the city. Insurance and Clearing students may be able to apply for any remaining rooms, subject to availability.

If we are unable to offer you accommodation, we will direct you to alternative housing options so you can make your own arrangements.

Accommodation contract

Once we have processed your application for accommodation we will send you an offer, subject to availability. If you accept the offer, it will become a legally binding agreement and you will be expected to make the rent payments in full. This also applies if you sign a contract with private accommodation that you have arranged yourself.

- Campus-based security team
- Experienced welfare support team
- Cleaning and maintenance service
- Chargeable laundry facilities
- Secure cycle storage
- Personal contents insurance

Residential Developments

The exciting new building developments taking place on the Streatham campus mean that there are fewer rooms available on campus until the completion of the project. To meet our Accommodation Guarantee you may be offered a place in University or approved partner accommodation within the city, even if it wasn't one of your application preferences.

All of our city-based residences are in convenient locations within walking distance to both the Streatham and St Luke's campuses, or a short cycle or bus journey. Approved partners have been carefully selected and offer quality facilities and attractive events programmes to help students to settle in.

Exeter is a small, vibrant city. Wherever you live, you'll be close to green spaces, cafes, and everything that makes the South West such a unique and inspiring place to study.

Developments on campus

The University of Exeter continually invests in its properties to provide new facilities and upgrade existing ones.

Work is carefully programmed to avoid disruption to students, particularly during exam periods. However, on occasion there may be some unavoidable disturbance or inconvenience to students.

We will notify you in advance of any significant building works which are in close proximity to your residence and further details will be made available on our website.

Al Qasimi building

A new research and teaching building is being developed to extend from the Institute of Arab and Islamic Studies (IAIS) into the Jubilee Gardens. This development is in close proximity to Mardon Hall (58) and Holland Hall (62). Works began in Summer 2026 and are due to complete ahead of the 2028/29 academic year (subject to change).

West Park and Birks Grange student residences

We are building our new West Park student residences and refurbishing Birks Grange catered accommodation on the Streatham campus in the Clydesdale area. Holland Hall (62), Mardon Hall (58), Nash Grove E-F blocks (57) and Birks Grange Village (66) are in close proximity to the construction area. We expect students to move into the new accommodation by September 2027, with works completing during the academic year 2028-29.

COMING SOON TO THE STREATHAM CAMPUS

New student accommodation, offering an enhanced student living community in the west quarter.

West Park and Birks Grange Village

- Over 1,800 new and refurbished self-catered bedrooms
- A mix of standard and ensuite facilities
- Access to communal study, social and recreational spaces
- Including a new convenience store

Phase one: Over 600 rooms will be available to students from September 2027. Applications will open in April 2027.
