

Your Moving In Checklist



To help you feel prepared when you arrive at University, here's a rough guide to what you'll need to bring.

TO GET YOU STARTED

Don't feel you need to bring everything with you at once, just a few basic essentials will do.

There are a range of shops on campus, in the city and online to buy the other things you need once you've moved in.

Please check opening times before visiting - in particular, some shops close around 16:00 on Sundays.

IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS

You might need to bring some important documents with you, such as:

KITCHEN

If you're moving into a **self-catered** residence, you might want to bring:

- ✓ Cutlery and basic crockery (plate, bowl, mug and glass)
- ✓ Cooking utensils (sharp knife, bread knife, wooden spoon, spatula and slotted spoon)
- A large and a medium saucepan, a frying pan or wok, baking tray and a chopping board
- √ Food storage containers
- ✓ Cling film, tin foil, fridge/freezer bags and tea towels



Other items you might want to bring:

Cheese grater
Vegetable peeler
Tin and bottle opener
Scissors

If you're
moving into a
catered residence,
you will have use of a utility room
and may want to bring:

- ✓ Cutlery and basic crockery (Plate, bowl, mug and glass)
- ✓ Cling film, tin foil, fridge/freezer bags and tea towels
- Washing up liquid, cloths and basic cleaning products

BEDROOM / BATHROOM

- ✓ Duvet, pillows, duvet cover, pillow cases, sheet (non-fitted), blanket/throw
- ✓ Ensure you choose the correct bedding size for your residence e.g. single or double
- ✓ Towels, personal toiletries and toilet roll
- ✓ Coat hangers
- ✓ CE marked extension lead and UK plug adapters (if required). Don't forget chargers for your phone and other devices!



- ✓ Cleaning products and cleaning cloths
- ✓ Laundry basket and washing detergent

SHARE AND COLLAB

These are things you can arrange to share with your flatmates once you arrive, to split the cost and avoid having duplicates.

- ✓ Toaster
- √ Rice cooker
- ✓ Mixing bowls, measuring jug
- ✓ Weighing scales
- ✓ Oven gloves
- ✓ Cleaning products



These items are **not** allowed in University residences:

- X Clothes airer/dryer
- X Portable heaters/fan heaters
- X Dehumidifiers
- X Candles/incense. How about using battery-lit candles instead?
- X Electric blanket
- X Additional furniture
- Plug-in decorative lights. Battery-operated lights are fine!
- Any type of adhesive fixings e.g. coat, picture hooks or white/BluTak. We ask that you only use the noticeboards to display things on your walls, so bringing drawing pins might be handy
