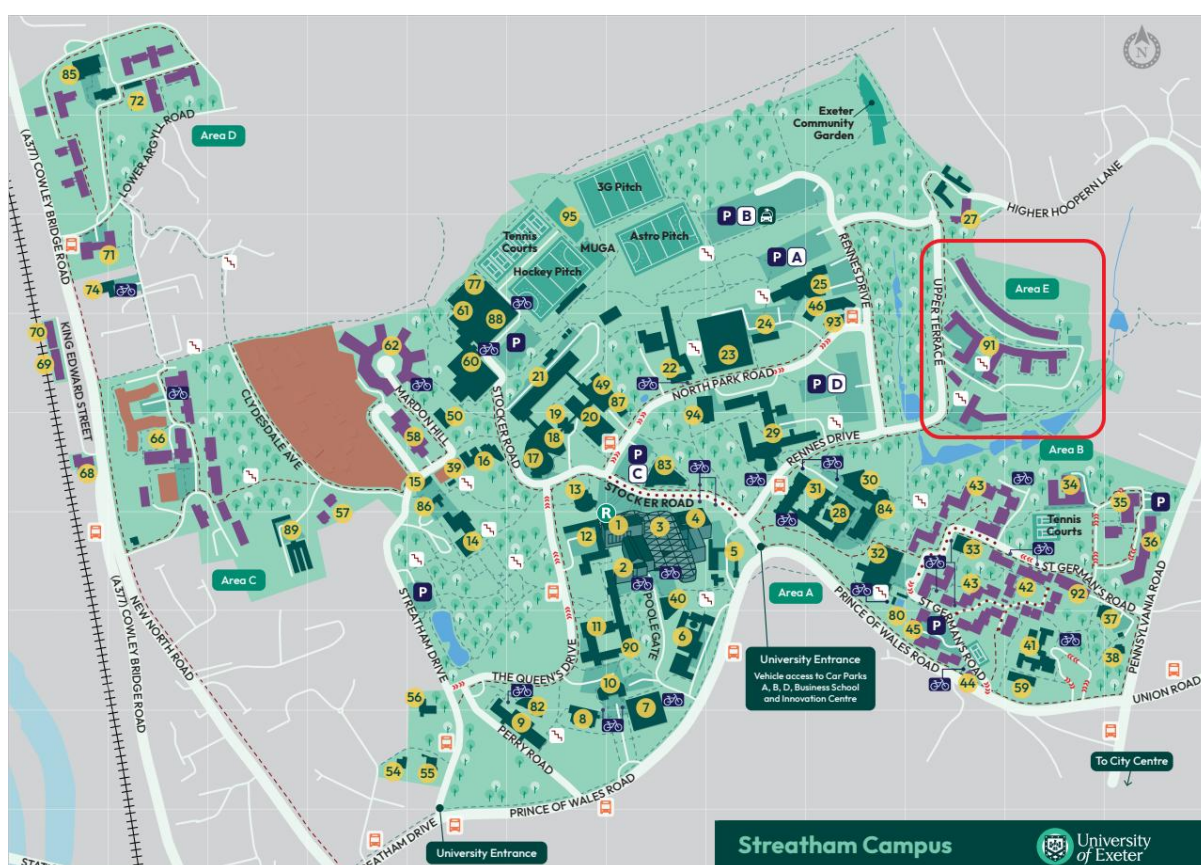


Your arrival to accommodation at East Park (blocks F, G, K & L)

This information is relevant to students arriving on **Friday 11, Saturday 12 or Sunday 13 September 2026 between 09:00 – 23:30 ONLY**, who will be living in blocks F, G, K or L. If you will be living in another block at East Park, please return to the [previous webpage](#) and select the relevant document. If you will be arriving after Welcome Weekend, please return to the [previous webpage](#) and refer to the information about 'Arriving outside of reception opening hours'.

Welcome to Exeter! We hope this information helps you understand what to expect when you arrive at your accommodation.

This is a map of Streatham Campus – available [here](#) – and we've shown the location of East Park (#91) with a red border:



If you are arriving between 09:00-23:30 on Friday 11, Saturday 12 or Sunday 13 September, then you will need to go to the East Park **main reception in Block F** to collect your keys.



A one-way system will operate for traffic around East Park. Cars will come in via Rennes Drive (not labelled on this map, but it is the road with the red arrow at the bottom left of this image) and turn down Upper Terrace, heading to main reception (shown with a red border).

The postcode for East Park is EX4 4GX.

The full version of this map is included at the end of this document.



This is the University entrance at Stocker Road, coming off Prince of Wales Road, viewed from both directions.

Turn in here and follow the road round to the right which becomes Rennes Drive.



Stay on Rennes Drive, bearing left to continue up the hill. You will pass the lower entrance to East Park but over the Welcome Weekend this serves as an exit route only.



Keep going up Rennes Drive. You'll pass car park D on the left-hand side, which is one of the car parks you can use after you've unloaded your belongings.



After continuing up Rennes Drive and over a mini roundabout, take the next turning on the right, signposted to East Park.

Useful to know – if you need a car park later, you can get to car parks A and B by turning left / straight on here instead of right.





After about 200m you will see the entrance to East Park on the right-hand side. Turn in here.



At this point continue straight ahead, downhill, to get to the main reception in F block. Do not turn left here.



Depending on your arrival time, you may see traffic attendants here, who should be wearing hi-vis jackets. They will help direct you to the appropriate parking area so that you can collect your key.



As you head further down the hill, the next turning on the left takes you to the main reception at F block. You can use one of the parking bays here while you go into reception to collect your key/fob.



Inside, the staff will need to see your photo ID so that they can give you your key/fob and other helpful information.

You will have 30 minutes to unload your car before it will need to be moved to central parking on campus.



You might see Student Helpers around the residences.

They will be wearing yellow jackets and can help you find your room or give you directions.



If you see a trolley like this, you can borrow it to help move your belongings to your room. Please return it once you have finished using it, so it is ready for the next person.

Have fun unpacking and making your room your home!



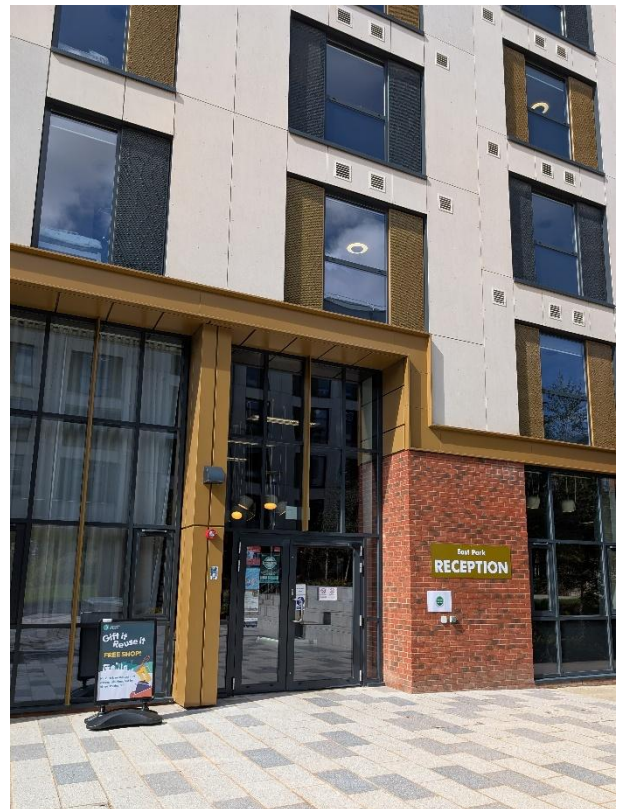
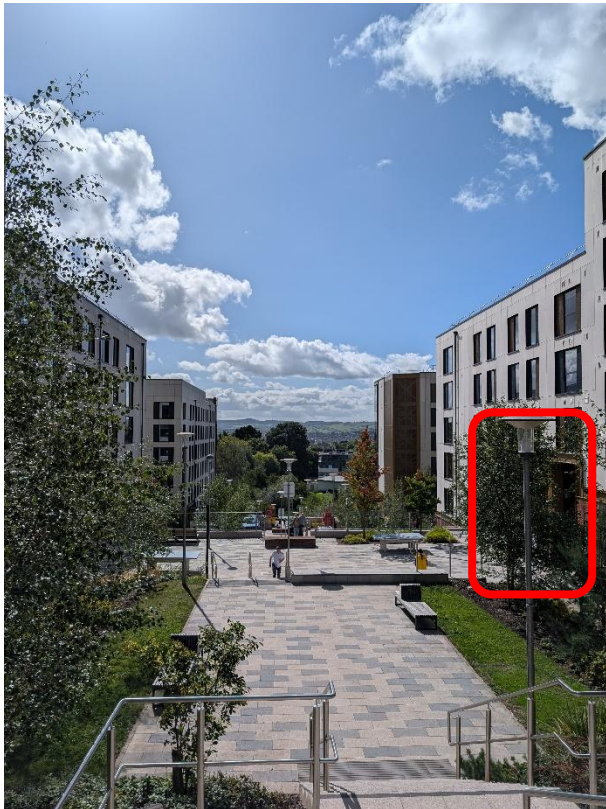
To exit East Park, return to the access road, and follow it all the way down to the bottom of the hill.

Don't worry about the No Entry sign, as a one-way system is in operation over the Welcome weekend.



At the bottom of the hill you will meet up with Rennes Drive again.

You can either turn right to get to one of the main car parks, or head straight on to exit the campus.



Useful to know! If you need to get to the main reception on foot then it has another entrance on the opposite side of the building, next to the main steps which run between the blocks. It's a bit hidden by the trees in the left-hand photo, so we've indicated it with the red border. If you need step-free access, there are lifts at the upper and lower parts of F-block. Sloped paths also criss-cross the rest of the site.

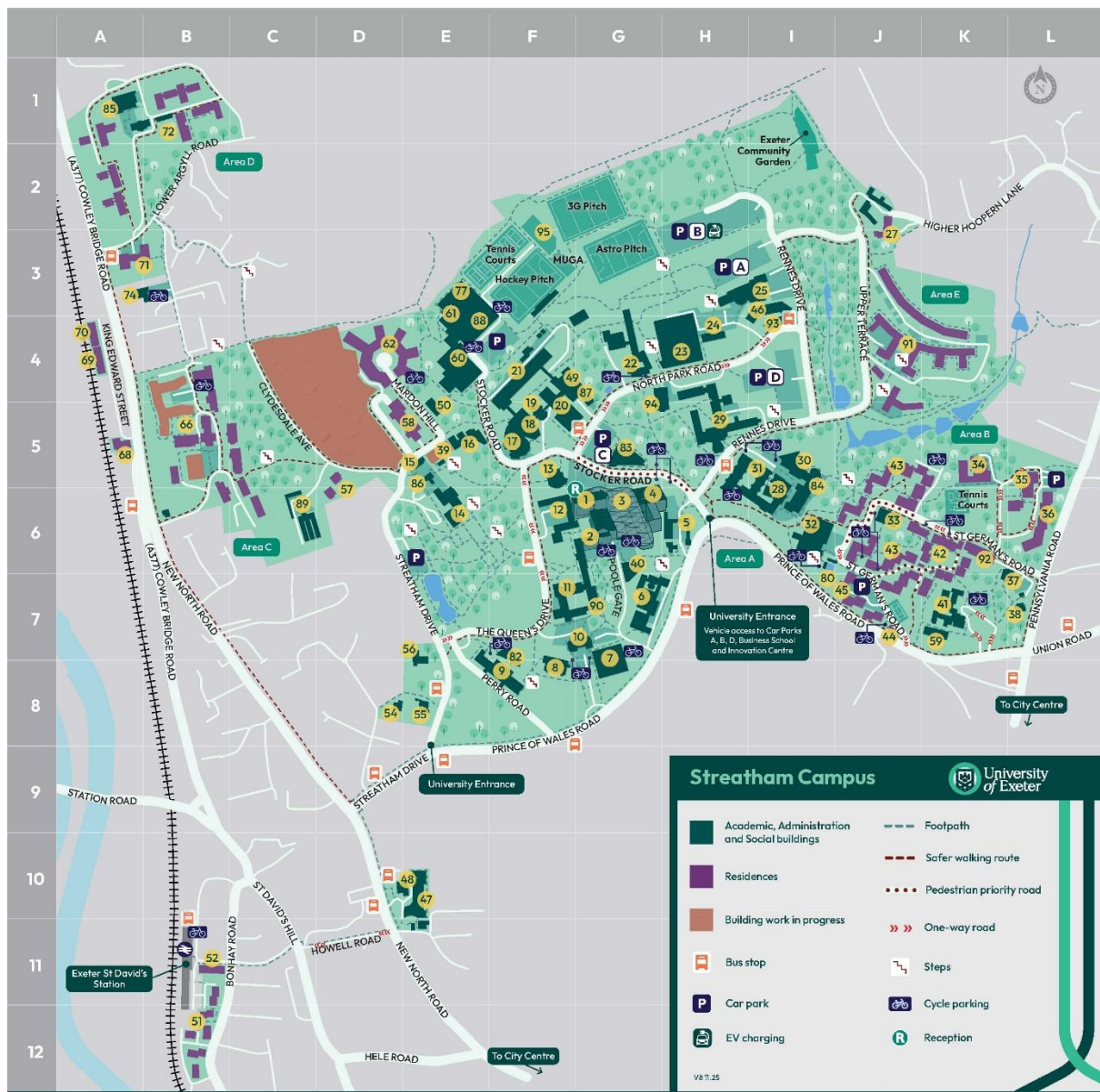

- Please make sure you have completed your Welcome Induction for your accommodation. You will receive an email from the Accommodation Office advising when this is available to you, and you access it by logging in to your accommodation account. It takes you through lots of important information about living in accommodation and specifics to your residence.
- Once you have completed the Welcome Induction you will be able to book your arrival slot.
- On the following pages are a full map of Streatham Campus and the East Park area. There are a few different footpaths which you can take to get to the central campus. You will also see the 'Safer Walking Route' which is marked in brown. These dedicated walkways have enhanced lighting along with coverage by the University CCTV cameras along many paths. Keep an eye out for the green floor dots and lamppost signs that mark out the routes on campus.
