Life in the South West - Exeter

Exeter is home to our largest site, the Streatham Campus, which is situated on the edge of the city, and St Luke's Campus in the centre.

With a population of 130,000, Exeter is a young, student-friendly city with 17% of people aged between 18 and 24.

Exeter boasts a high quality of life and low crime rate, a quarter of Exeter's population study or work at the University.

There is plenty to do in Exeter too – with high street brands galore and numerous unique independent stores, Exeter packs quite a shopping punch for a compact city. There's something for everyone within the city's shopping centres, quirky stores, cobbled streets and markets, as well as a sizeable arts centre and creative hub right in the city centre.

There is a variety of travel options for Exeter – with great direct train links to London from both the Exeter Central and Exeter St David's stations, as well as to multiple countries from Exeter International Airport.

If you drive, Exeter is conveniently just off the M5 so it doesn't take long to drive to other major cities like Bristol (1hr) or Cardiff (2hrs).

Life in the South West – Penryn and Truro

The University of Exeter has two sites in Cornwall: the Penryn Campus, which uniquely shares its space with Falmouth University; and the University's Medical School at Truro Hospital.

A huge benefit to our Cornish bases are the beaches! Just nearby there are: Castle, Maenporth, Gyllyngvase and Swanpool.

Some of these offer opportunities for kayak and paddleboard rental, beach games, swimming and – in the right conditions – even surfing.

Our Penryn Campus sits on the edge of the coastal town of Falmouth. This area has become home to a thriving cluster of creative enterprise and sustainable innovation.

Truro is a short bus or train ride away. The city boasts stunning views of the impressive Truro Cathedral – site of the Cornwall campuses' graduation ceremonies – as well as many opportunities for shopping, dining, and culture.

There is also fantastic surfing on the north coast, art galleries in St Ives, the beautiful gardens at the Eden Project, and the breathtaking views on The Lizard and Bodmin Moor. All of these and other destinations are easily explored by bus, train, car and bicycle, or even, via the Coastal Path, on foot.

Working at the University of Exeter comes with benefits, as there is a strong ethos in having a happy and flexible work / life balance.

Some of the benefits include:

- ☐ Hybrid working many roles are available to work from home as well as the office, depending on suitability.
- ☐ Flexibility and the option to do compressed hours where possible.
- ☐ 39 days annual leave inclusive of bank holidays and closure days.
- ☐ Opportunity to buy additional days of annual leave.
- ☐ Strong pension schemes.
- ☐ Up to 26 weeks full pay for maternity, adoption and shared parental and six weeks full pay paternity leave.
- ☐ The Career Break Scheme: a facility for staff to request an unpaid extended period away from their work to fulfil these personal obligations and requirements.
