

Database access

National Police Library Catalogue (freely available on the internet) A comprehensive index to the collection and a database of policing and related subjects.

It contains books, reports, theses, multimedia and over 30,000 articles from the journals. It also contains links to full text material where available.



ProQuest (available through the Police National Network) Coverage: education, political science, social science and sociology. It searches 10 commercial databases with thousands of full text journals.



Emerald (available through the Police National Network) Coverage: leadership and business management, now with a growing content in the social sciences, public policy and education. It searches a portfolio of over 290 journals and 2,000 books and book series

Medline/Web of Science (available to College of Policing staff via Athens) Coverage: medicine, life sciences, sciences, social sciences, arts and humanities.

'Web of Knowledge' incorporates Medline (US National Library of Medicine database with global coverage of 4900 journals) and Web of Science (12,000 journals and 120,000 conference proceedings).
