The University of Exeter is offering scholarships to international students from Bangladesh, Canada, Egypt, Ghana, India, Indonesia, Japan, Kenya, Malaysia, Nepal, Nigeria, Pakistan, Thailand, Turkey and Vietnam. These scholarships help make sure aspiring students from these countries can pursue their chosen taught Masters degree and take their place in our thriving university community. Here, students will develop their academic skills for the future and contribute to a diverse student experience.

These awards are for one year only and are not recurrent for subsequent years of study.

2. Applicant eligibility

Applicants who:

- are a citizen/passport holder of Bangladesh, Canada, Egypt, Ghana, India, Indonesia, Japan, Kenya, Malaysia, Nepal, Nigeria, Pakistan, Thailand, Turkey or Vietnam and therefore classed as an International student for fees purposes; and
- already hold an offer (conditional or unconditional) to study an eligible Postgraduate taught programme at the University of Exeter beginning in the 2026/27 academic year.

3. Programme eligibility

Scholarships are available for September 2026 entry for campus-based Postgraduate Taught degrees in the following departments:

Ineligible PGT programmes are: One Planet MBA; MA International Film Business; MSc Island Biodiversity and Conservation; Clinical Psychology programmes delivered by Clinical Education, Development and Research (CEDAR); DEdPsych Educational Child and Community Psychology; Master of Public Administration (MPA) with Applied Study; Law programmes delivered by the University of Law, MA Law (SQE1), MA Law (Conversion), LLM Legal Practice (SQE 1&2), SQE Preparation Courses); Graduate Law LLB; MiPDAL Dual Masters in Intellectual Property Law; Postgraduate Certificates; Postgraduate Diplomas; Degree Apprenticeships. Fully online or distance learning programmes are also not eligible.

Information on programmes for January 2027 entry will be available in due course.

4. Selection criteria

These awards will be allocated automatically to eligible applicants applying for an eligible programme by 31 July 2026 for September 2026 entry (Round 1) and 1 December 2026 for any eligible programmes open for January 2027 entry (Round 2). Awards may be allocated to late applicants at the University's discretion.

5. Scholarship application process

No scholarship application is required.

To accept an award, applicants should confirm their study place, paying their tuition fee deposit by the deadline in their programme offer letter.

This scholarship will be included in the information in the Confirmation of Acceptance for Study (CAS) statement if applicable.

Awards will be received by eligible applicants who go on to enrol at the University of Exeter on an eligible programme in 2026/27.

6. Exclusions and Exceptions

These scholarships are intended for self-funded students.

If your tuition fees will be financed by an external body (such as an overseas government or Chevening, Commonwealth or a partner Institution) with whom the University has a shared financing agreement then this award may be invalidated or superseded with a different fee arrangement.

If you expect to receive funding from a charity this may also make you ineligible to receive this scholarship.

It is your responsibility to inform us if you are in receipt of any external funding prior to enrolment; please email a copy of the award letter to admissions pg-ad@exeter.ac.uk

You cannot normally receive more than one scholarship (tuition fees discount) from the University of Exeter; if you are offered multiple scholarships, then you will be awarded whichever scholarship has the higher value. However, the following exceptions apply for one year of study (2026/27 academic year):

- Applicants eligible for an award under this University of Exeter Postgraduate Taught Scholarships 2026/27 scheme who are joining through an institutional progression agreement where a partial tuition fee discount is applied can receive both discounts, subject to a maximum award value of £10,000.
- Applicants eligible for an award under this University of Exeter Postgraduate Taught Scholarships 2026/27 scheme can receive this together with an Exeter Excellence Scholarships 2026/27 - Postgraduate Taught scheme award, subject to a maximum award value of £10,000.

7. Award payment

If you defer your 2026/27 offer or change fee status, then your scholarship offer will be invalidated.

If you transfer to an ineligible programme, then your scholarship offer will be invalidated.

This scholarship will be awarded as a reduction in tuition fees; it cannot be paid as cash or attributed to other charges such as accommodation fees. It will be automatically deducted from your first-year tuition fees following enrolment. If you choose to pay your tuition fees in instalments, the award will be deducted from the total annual tuition fee and the remaining balance split accordingly.

Tuition fees deduction/s due are applied to your student account and show in your online statement within the first four weeks of study. Any awardees studying part time (under the relevant visa regulations) will receive the full Scholarship deduction in their first year. Where multiple awards have been offered, in line with the relevant exclusions and exceptions, ineligible scholarships may be removed during the first term of study.

In the event that you withdraw or interrupt your studies post enrolment then the University Finance regulations at that date will apply as regards any repayment, subsequent adjustments to fees or other requirements:
