	University of Exeter Alumni Scholarship 2026/27 and Class of 2026 Progression Scholarship
1. Award Amount/s	
<p>These scholarship awards are worth 20% of the first year Postgraduate tuition fees. They are not recurrent for subsequent years of study.</p>	
2. Applicant eligibility	
<p>Awards are available to home and international University of Exeter alumni and finalists who have:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • graduated from an undergraduate degree or postgraduate certificate, diploma or degree awarded by the University of Exeter; or • completed an inbound Study Abroad semester/year at the University of Exeter; or • completed a credit-bearing University of Exeter International Summer School; or • completed a University of Exeter online credit-bearing short course (micro credential). 	
3. Programme eligibility	
<p>Awards are available for students enrolling on most* standalone (campus-based or online) taught Masters degrees (e.g. MA, MSc, MRes, MFA, LL.M, PGCert, PGDip) or research degrees (e.g. MPhil/PhD), and certain online credit-bearing short courses, in 2026/27. The PGCE programme is also eligible for this award.</p> <p>*Exclusions are:</p> <p>Progression within the same programme, such as between or from micro credentials, between or from a PGCert and a PGDip, to a Masters, or from MPhil to PhD is not eligible for an award under this scheme. (Progression from a standalone Masters to a standalone research degree is eligible.)</p> <p>Progression to online programmes/courses in the Faculty of Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences - MA Education (Online), MA Creative Writing (Online) and micro credentials - is not eligible for an award under this scheme.</p> <p>MiPDAL Dual Masters in Intellectual Property Law, Graduate Law LLB and law programmes delivered by the University of Law are not eligible.</p>	
4. Scholarship application process	
<p>This scholarship award will be applied automatically to eligible postgraduate applicants enrolling for study in 2026/27 (1 September 2026 – 31 August 2027). A separate scholarship application is not required.</p>	

5. Exclusions and Exceptions

You cannot normally receive more than one scholarship (tuition fees discount) from the University of Exeter; if you are offered multiple scholarships, then you will be awarded whichever scholarship has the higher value.

If your tuition fees will be financed by an external body (such as an overseas government or a partner Institution) with whom the University has a shared financing agreement, then this award may be invalidated or superseded with a different fee arrangement.

If you expect to receive funding from a charity this may also make you ineligible to receive this scholarship.

6. Award payment

If you defer your 2026/27 offer, then your scholarship offer will be invalidated.

If you transfer to an ineligible programme, then your scholarship offer will be invalidated.

This scholarship will be awarded as a reduction in tuition fees; it cannot be paid as cash or attributed to other charges such as accommodation fees. It will be automatically deducted from your first year tuition fees following enrolment. If you choose to pay your tuition fees in instalments, the award will be deducted from the total annual tuition fee and the remaining balance split accordingly.

Tuition fees reduction/s due are applied to your student account and show in your online statement within the first four weeks of study. Any awardees studying part time will receive the full Scholarship in their first year (calculated at 20% of the full-time tuition fees). Arrangements for applying the reduction for online programmes may vary and be advised individually. Where multiple awards have been offered, in line with the relevant exclusions and exceptions, ineligible scholarships may be removed during the first term of study.

In the event that you withdraw or interrupt your studies post enrolment then the University Finance regulations at that date will apply as regards any repayment, subsequent adjustments to fees or other requirements:
