Getting around Exeter

On Foot...

You can explore the history of Exeter by joining a free walking tour led by <u>Exeter Red Coat Guides</u> – just turn up, no need to book in advance.

By Bus...

4 bus service connects the Streatham campus with Exeter St David's station, the city centre and St. Luke's campus. Runs every 10–15 mins.

H bus service links St Luke's campus with the city centre and both Exeter Central and Exeter St David's railway stations.

Stagecoach bus app

Single bus fares are capped at £3 for almost **all** bus journeys in the UK. Local, short trips are £2 each way in Exeter.

Student <u>termly bus passes</u> are available for unlimited bus travel. £243 for one term.

By Bike

<u>Saddles & Paddles</u> bike hire £27 per day with student discount

Buy second hand – <u>Ride On</u>. Around £120 for a basic refurbished bike. You could try Facebook Marketplace or <u>gumtree.com</u> – Meet outside seller's house!



Travelling in the UK by coach

Slower but often cheaper than trains

Good for London and airports.

Exeter – London takes around 4.5 hours.

National Express

<u>Young Persons Coachcard</u> (available to **all** full-time students) - £15 – save one-third on National Express coach fares.

Megabus 10% discount on coach fares with a TOTUM card; free wifi and charging points available on most services

Flixbus Cheap fares from Exeter to Plymouth, Bristol, London and beyond

Download the <u>Trainline app</u> for iOS and Android


16-25 Railcard: £30 for one year – save one-third off train ticket prices <u>16-25railcard.co.uk</u>

National Trust

- •Conservation charity that cares for areas of woodland, coastline and historic buildings all over the country.
- •The closest location to Exeter is Killerton which is accessible by public transport. You can also reach Castle Drogo on Dartmoor by bus.
- •If aged 18-25, you're eligible for a Young Person's membership £45.60 per year or £3.80 per month





London

- Make sure you plan!
- <u>daysoutguide.co.uk</u> 2 for 1 entry to many London attractions (and elsewhere in the UK) if travelling by train.
- Oyster card A pre-pay travel card for use on the Tube and London buses. Ask staff at a Tube station to load your 16-25 Railcard onto your Oyster card to save one-third off Off-Peak Tube fares
- Lots of free places to visit (may need to book in advance)
- Natural History Museum Get a free ticket to skip the queue!
- Sky Garden
- Themed walking tours

Exploring Devon by train

Devon's Rail Network

- Access to Dartmoor
- Access to Coastal locations
- Walking and cycling routes



Dartmoor Line

- Train from Exeter to Okehampton (£9.20 return, less with a railcard or GroupSave)
- Lots of walks from the station out to Dartmoor
- Walking and cycling on The Granite Way 11 mile multi-use trail





The Avocet Line



- Train from Exeter to Exmouth
- Short 22 min journey, £6.70 (cheaper with Railcard or GroupSave)
- Exmouth beach and town
- Topsham- food destination
- Exe-Estuary trail for easy walking and cycling

Prices and discounts

- For exploring Devon in a day, you can buy an Off-Peak Day return ticket. These tickets can be bought for travel after 9am Mon-Fri or anytime at weekends
- Railcards- you can buy a young person's railcard whilst you are studying in the UK. This gives you 1/3 off off-peak fares across the UK. The railcard costs £35 for a year
- GroupSave- groups of 3 to 9 adults can travel together and get a 1/3 off the price of an off-peak ticket
